Connecticut Yankee

Of the cynical and realistic arguments against primaries that they can be controlled by the same bosses who control conventions. In the Hartford County primary for the Democratic nomination for Congress, that happened to prove quite so. The relative strength of the two contestants remained about the same from the convention which first-handled the question of the nomination, through the primary which finally settled it. Communities where the bosses were "for" went "for" and vice versa. From that point of view, the primary was a waste of time.

We are continually surprised by Americans to find just how extreme other nations can be in safeguarding what they think are their own sovereign rights. The chief reason we are surprised is that we have no other nation on our own soil, and therefore lack perspective of our own.

At Manila, we are conducting negotiations with the nation which we gave freedom, according to our own promise. We regard that nation fondly as a mother's child, and we consider it only natural that, even after freedom, there should be certain ties between us. We think of them as ties of affection and common policy, rather than as any claim by us. We consider it especially timely that we should maintain in the Philippines, military bases jointly for the defense of the Philippines and of our own position in the world.

But the Philippines, having obtained their independence from us, and having obtained it so recently, is to establish a new constitution for themselves, are much more difficult customers for us than the British, from whom we ourselves won our own freedom, on the question of American bases in Britain.

We think we are doing the Philippines a favor by maintaining bases there. Yet the Philippine negotiators have been asking one concession after another, and the least concession they have asked is something no other nation on whose territory we maintain bases has thought of asking. It is that the Philippines want legal jurisdiction over our personnel there, not merely when that personnel ventures out into Philippine life, but even when that personnel is within the confines of its own base. What are we to do, ahead of having our bases treated as if, within their own boundaries, they were American soil? But the Philippine best friends do not want even that kind of shadow on our own sovereignty.

In order to comprehend this feeling, we would, of course, have to transport ourselves back into the days when we ourselves were very young in our freedom, and imagine that some friendly foreign power had, for our protection, established special islands of military force and sovereignty just outside Washington and New York. How long would we be grateful? How soon would we insist that the American flag, and no other, fly over the spots of territory in question? How soon would we demand, on our own behalf, that the armed forces of another nation? If we could perform this little feat of imagination, we would discover the Philippines acting quite naturally, and on schedule.

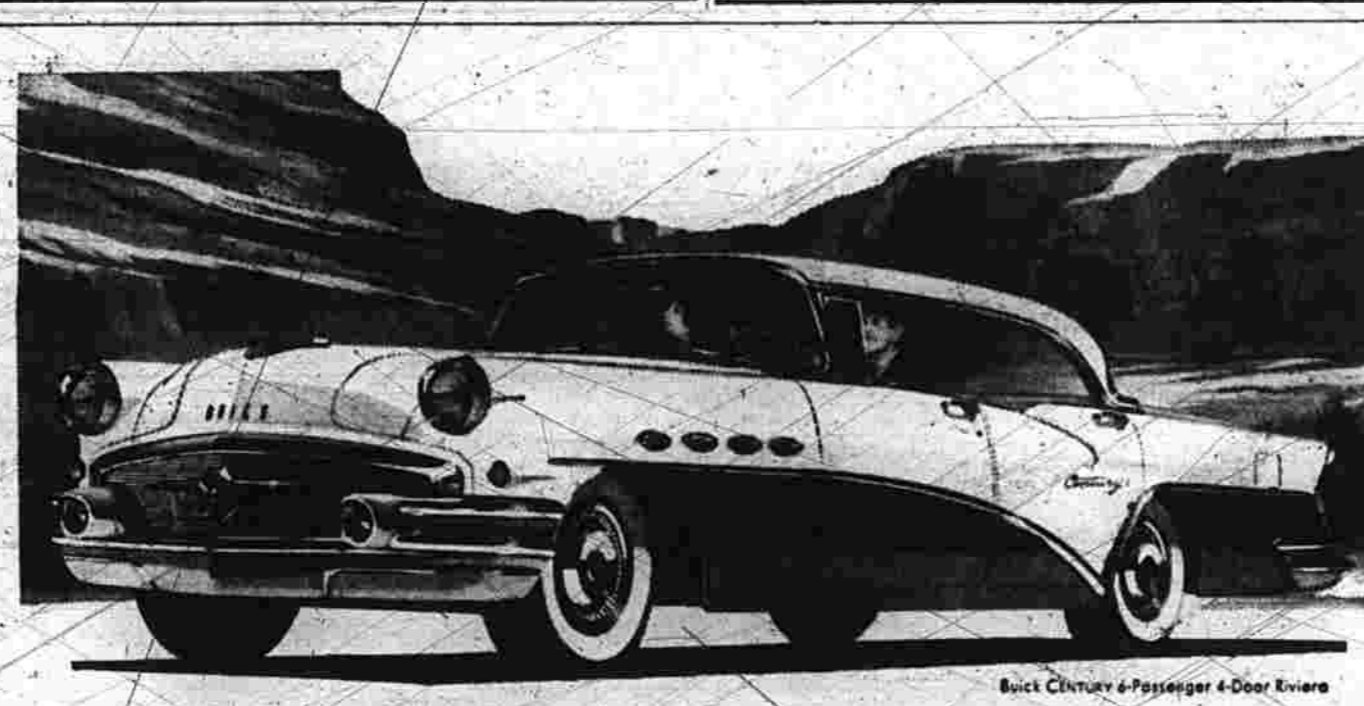

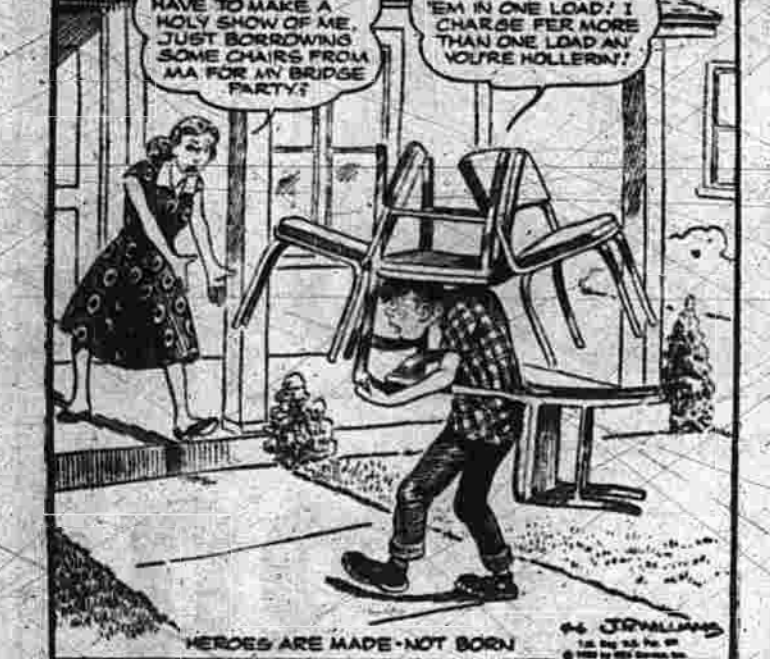

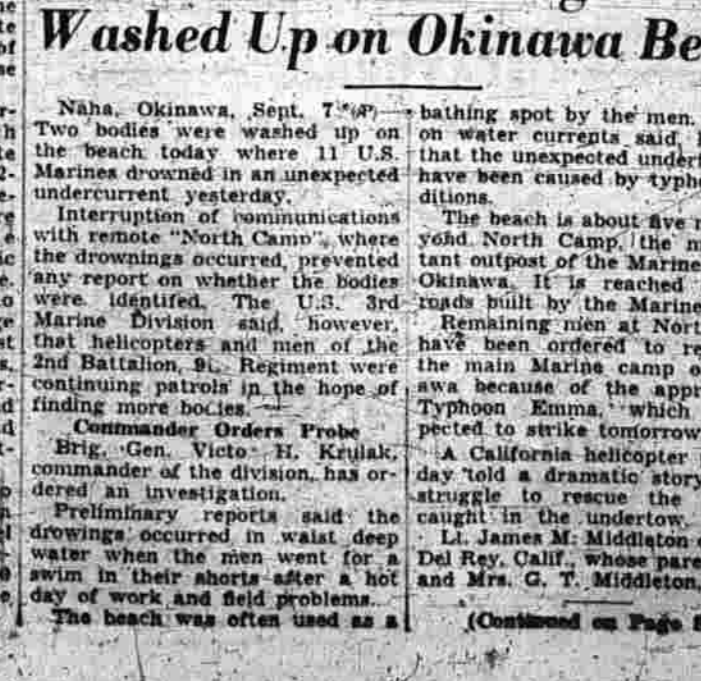
