I am not in favor of public money being spent to improve privately owned and operated parking lots. COUNTRY CLUB

The situation should be settled in the best way for the town, with due consideration given to the present lessors.

TOWN CLERK

The matter of our Town Clerk-fees vs. salary-has been a subject of debate for a long time. Manchester grew to a point long ago when the estimated income of the town clerk's office seemed all out of proportion to other official salaries and wages. For many years while Samuel Sr. was in office, the matter was held in abeyance because he was not in good health and it used to get him all shook up whenever the topic was mentioned. Now Samuel Jr. has ascended the throne, but neither the GOP or Dem High Commands seem to want to push the issue. I believe it is accurate to say that no other town in Connecticut of a size near ours still tolerates a town clerk on the fee system, I think it is high time we quit stalling here. NEW YORK, NEW HAVEN and HARTFORD RAILROAD Our main line railroad service to Boston was interrupted last year by the August flood, due to a washed out bridge at Putnam. The Railroad wants to discontinue permanently through freight and passenger service to Boston, claiming it was losing money on our line. If towns and cities along the line want to see such service restored, they ought to be willing to help out. A bill can be introduced in the next General Assembly authorizing towns and cities, if they choose, to contribute public funds in cooperation with the railroad toward repairing damage to railroad structures and rights-of-way caused by natural calamities. I favor it.

You probably went in and sat there and sat and sat and waited and waited for several hours until your turn came on the program, which the present board schedules near the last of the meeting. That isn't right. If people have any business with the board, they should be allowed to present it early in the evening and not be required to hang around so late. I favor permitting the public to have its chance to talk early in the meetings, as it was with the previous board.

WATER DEPARTMENT

The business of the Water Department of the town has grown to such an extent that I think it ought to be changed from its present set-up to one of virtual independence, with its own commission and superintendent. Water Department matters are usually considered at the close of the directors' meetings when everybody is tired and wants to get away. The general manager as superintendent has enough to look out for without taking on the water duties. The department will get more attention and better consideration if it is separated and established by itself, with practical controls, Method of accomplishment—by a special act in the next General Assembly amending or rewriting Chapter XII of our charter, with a referendum. I favor it.


