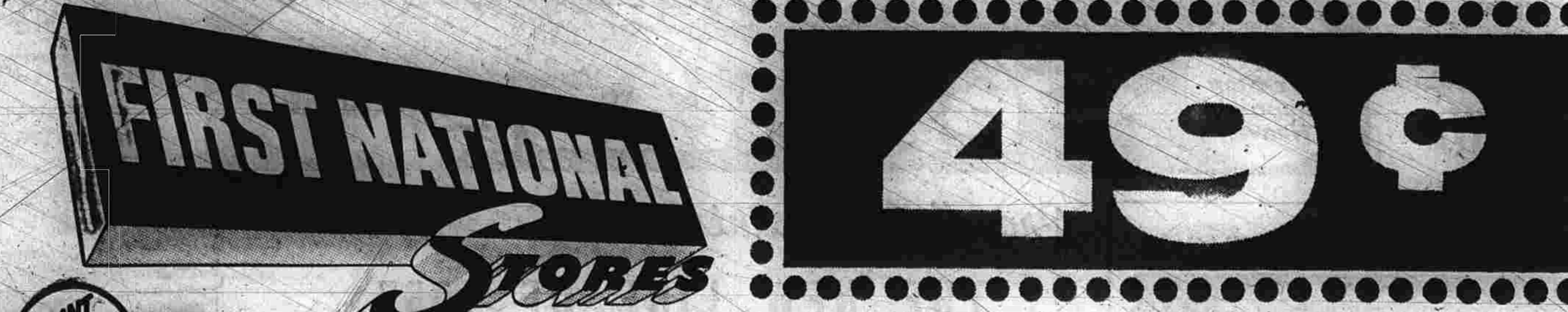

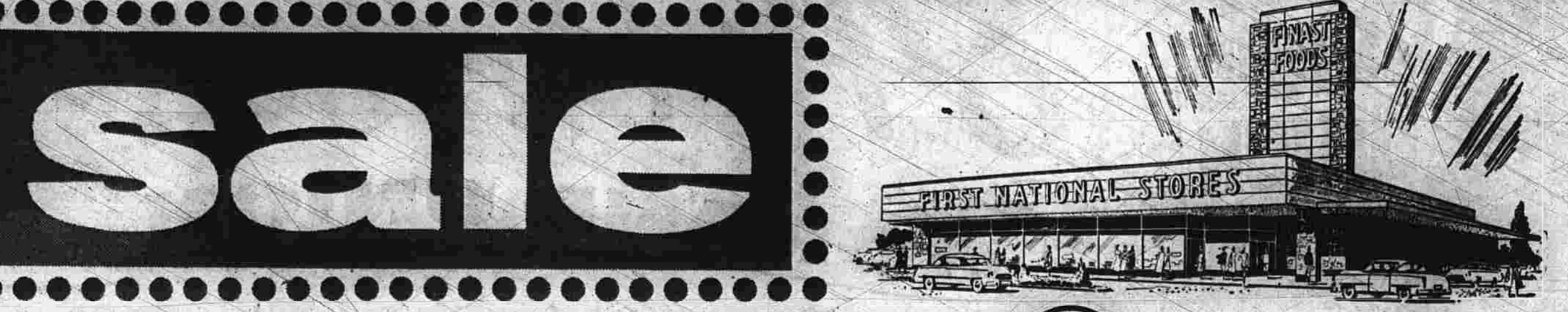

Mayor of Formosa Teaches Honesty Most Vital Lesson

Taipei, Formosa, Sept. 13 (AP)—The most important thing we must learn is how to be honest, said the outspoken mayor of this capital city.

As Kao Yieh-shan sees it, honesty is simply a question of survival for the 10 million Chinese of this island.

Runs City Honestly

"One of the best things in free China is the common feeling that we have to do something good, otherwise we all are suicides," he said. "Encouraged by this basic thought, I am running, my city

honestly and will continue doing so until my time is up.

"So many people thought being mayor or governor was only a good opportunity to make money," he said.

"But the little people hate this attitude. When I took over, my office I announced publicly how much I earned and what my income was as well as my wife's. I will open my books again when I quit six months from now."

"To almost everyone's surprise, including his own, he dedicated the candidate of the dominant Kuomintang party in 1954. As an inde-

pendent he promised to sweep out bureaucrats, keep his door open to the humblest people and to improve living conditions for the poor. He picked up his campaign tactics by observing the 1952 election in the United States.

In winning, Henry Kao—as he is known to foreigners—made powerful enemies among the less intelligent members of the Kuomintang, the political party which once ruled China's 500 millions. Political and personal attacks against him have been almost unceasing.

"The lower level of the Kuomintang cannot forgive me for having won," he says. "But those at the top are more fair. If I don't have their support I wouldn't be able to hold the job today."

Kuomintang Asset

In a sense he is a Kuomintang asset before the Western world.

New Boom Seen For Klondike Hub

Dawson City, Yukon territory, Sept. 11 (AP)—There's a talk of another boom in this town that was the hub of the Klondike 60 years ago.

Today the magic word is asbestos. Though none suspects a boom to match the gold rush of the 1890s, many believe the once proud Yukon capital is on the brink of important developments.

The Western Miner and Oil Review has said:

"Preliminary surveys at Caesars Creek, 37 miles north of Dawson City, indicate deposits of at least

one million tons of asbestos of processable quality."

Mining authorities say transportation is costly, but if the ore is there in sufficient quantities, commercial interests will find a way to get it out. As of now the ore would have to be trucked more than 300 miles from Dawson City to Whitehorse. Then shipped about 100 miles by rail to Skagway, Alaska, where ocean vessels would take over.

One proposal is that the Pacific Great Eastern Railway which now runs from North Vancouver to Prince George, B. C., be extended north to Fairbanks, Alaska. Such a route would include Dawson City, a town of 500.

Shivers Raises Point On Defiance of Court

By BEN PRICE. (AP News Analyst).—Washington, Sept. 13 (AP).—Gov. Allan Shivers of Texas has raised a point which lies at the heart of the school integration problem. What happens when there is open defiance of a federal court order? So far the question has been academic, but in the case of Mansfield, Tex., it came close to being raised in concrete form.

A federal court ordered the Mansfield School Board to stop discriminating against the admission of students on the basis of race. The practical effect of this order was to decree the admission of 12 Negro students to Mansfield High School.

When school opened, however, a mob gathered and threatened violence if any Negroes actually sought to enroll. Shivers the next day, Tex. a danger to Mansfield to help maintain law and order, instructed them to transfer "any scholars, white or colored, whose attendance or attempts to attend Mansfield High School would be reasonably calculated to incite violence."

In essence, the governor said that if violence threatened to accompany Negroes' entry to the school, they should be sent elsewhere. The Negroes dropped their suits against the school board, but Shivers denied this was defiance of the federal court, but added "should the resulting actions be federal court contempt of the act that the charge be laid against the governor and not the local people."

So what happens? Nothing at the moment. Federal courts are blind until there is official notification of a violation. Until the interested parties—the Negroes' lawyer or the school board's—come before the court and inform it the non-compliance with the order is being obeyed, the court will take no action.

But if the Negroes' or school board's attorney does appear, the court may be called upon to act against interference with the performance of its original order. This is violated, too, then individuals may be jailed by U.S. marshals for contempt of court—but marshals are process servers primarily, not general law enforcers.

If there is continued defiance, the matter becomes quite delicate. Federal courts in the past have no innate police power. Under the division of powers laid down in the constitution only the executive branch of the government can exercise force.

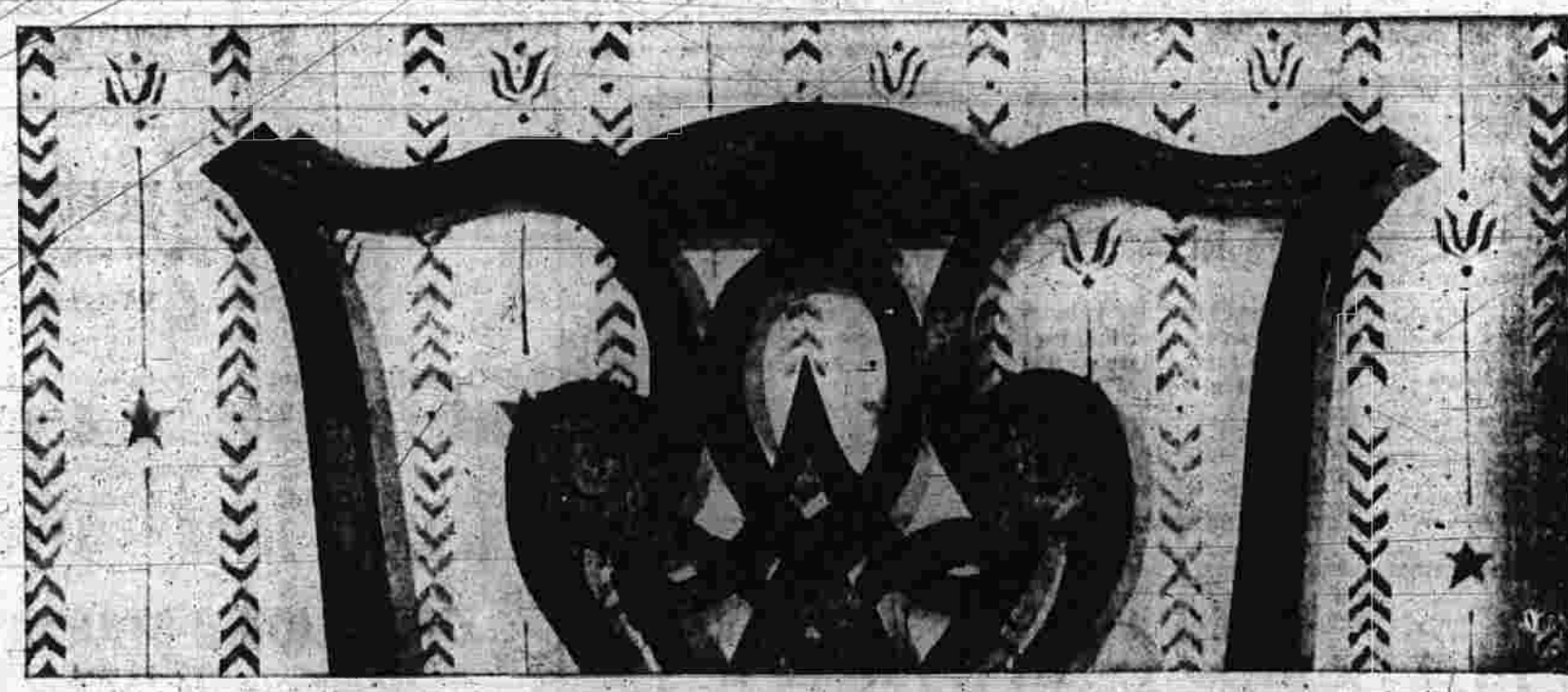
