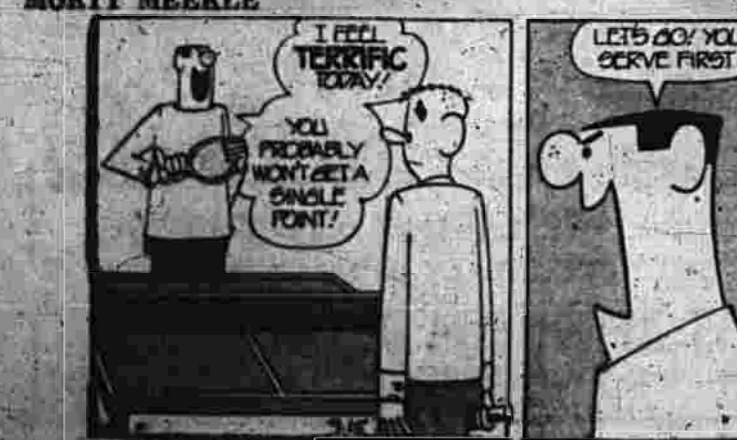

Dulles Denies U.S. to Pay For 'Detouring Suez Canal'

Washington, Sept. 17 (AP)—The government announced today that it is seeking cooperation of state oil regulatory bodies in a possibly substantial increase of domestic oil production.

H. A. Stewart, director of the Interior Department's Office of Oil and Gas, said he had telegraphed state oil officials in Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana and New Mexico asking them to meet with him here tomorrow or to send a representative.

Washington, Sept. 17 (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles said today that he is American plan to finance the "detouring of the Suez Canal."

Dulles told reporters at the White House that the United States is prepared to help finance, through the Export-Import Bank, increased exports of American oil to western nations if it can be shown that the canal is impractical or "closed."

Asked whether he was getting financial aid to other nations to help them transport oil around Africa and thus detour the canal, Dulles said the plan for international cooperation of a new conference financing of American oil exports.

"We have not gone beyond that in our planning," he said. "I believe we will go on to Dulles' plan."

The Secretary of State spent an hour with Eisenhower in addition to accepting international cooperation of a new conference financing of American oil exports.

In London, Dulles will participate in a meeting of all participants which failed in efforts to accept international cooperation of a new conference financing of American oil exports.

While the acceptance poured in from the countries expressing "misgivings about the idea of a Suez canal detouring," Dulles said he is not sure that the plan, denounced by Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser as a step toward war, will be carried out.

It is likely the first idea of the detouring of the canal was conceived through Suez—would be radically changed before the new London conference successor to the 1955 Suez conference of mid-August.

"Some sources speculated that the detouring of the canal was being planned to regulate the flow of oil through the Suez Canal." Dulles said.

"We are not trying to organize any boycott of the canal but we cannot be blind to the fact that conditions might become such that we should consider it as a practical or greatly diminished." Dulles said.

"There must always be ways to insure the flow of oil through the Suez Canal, particularly oil to western Europe. American oil exports are carrying out planning as a prudent measure to insure the flow of oil through the Suez Canal."
