Third Drop in Row for Farm Price

Washington, Sept. 29 (AP)—Average farm prices have dropped for the third straight week. An Agriculture Department official says he expects them to strengthen shortly.

A monthly report yesterday, the department said, farm prices fell about one-half percent between August and mid-September.

Since the war, farm prices have dropped by a total of 44 percent, but they are now a third of the way back to prewar levels.

The price level in mid-September was a shade above a year ago. But it was 28 percent under the record high of February 1951, in the middle of the Korean war.

Under Secretary of Agriculture T. D. Byrne said the slight decline in the September period indicated that the market was "very definitely strengthening during the harvest."

Byrne said he is confident that farm prices are "going to hold." And he said he expects the next movement will be further strengthening of prices.

The department's reporting board said that continued sharp decreases in prices received for most commercial crops and potatoes, and lower net prices for livestock, were the main factors in the drop.

On the other hand, the report said, prices for fruit, cotton and wool were higher.
