Estes said he realized many California independent voters were won over in 1952 by the prospect of a crusade held out by Eisenhower.

In India cow dung is needed both as fuel and fertilizer. The scarcity of wood and coal has led the Indian peasant to burn dried dung to cook his meals. This has made the soil poor.

Scientists of the Indian agricultural research institute think they may have an answer: The cow dung gas plant.

Seven such plants have been built in the village of Nangot, 10 miles from New Delhi. Agricultural peasants gather at the mud brick house of farmer Chaudhary Sahel Ram and discuss the merits of the gas plant.

Santa Monica, Calif., Oct. 4 (AP)—Actor George Bancroft, 74, died today after a long career in the theater and on the screen.

Bancroft was an actor most of his life, and even when he served for many years in the Navy he set up portable stages on deck and served as the impresario of all theatrical performances using Navy talent.

He went to sea as a seaman on merchant ships, later joined the Navy and was a gunner aboard the cruiser Baltimore in the battle of Manila Bay during the Spanish-American War.

Appointed to Annapolis in 1900 when the USS Oregon struck a submerged rock off the China coast, Bancroft swam beneath the hull of the vessel to learn the extent of the damage. For this feat of daring and gallantry he received an appointment to Annapolis, but he found the restrictions too confining and resigned and headed for Broadway.

For 15 years he played important roles in many successful shows, and 1922 launched his movie career. He became famous for his rugged characterizations and was played "Harry A. Taylor" in "Underworld," "The Wolf of Wall Street," "Deeds Goes to Town," "Submarine Patrol" and many other pictures.

Born in Philadelphia, Bancroft was born in Philadelphia, and was married in 1913 in Buffalo, N. Y. to Zona Broderick, an actress. Three years later he was wed to Octavia Broderick, a social comedy star, who survives him.

Miss Broderick sued him in 1934, alleging he had never obtained a divorce and demanding that she be recognized as his legal wife. Two years later the action was withdrawn and Bancroft was reported to have settled the case for \$25,000. The same year she also filed a Las Vegas, Nev. divorce. In addition to his widow, Bancroft leaves a daughter, Mrs. Margaret King of Pacific Palisades, Calif., and two grandchildren.
