## Call for Negotiations On Canal Operation

United Nations, N.Y., Oct. 8 (P)-Egypt and Russia today rejected the British-French approach to the Suez dispute but called for U.N. negotiations to establish a cooperative arrangement for the operation of the canal. Both told the U.N. Security Council that it is hopeless to seek a solution on the basis of the international control pro posal backed by Britain and France. Details of the proposed cooperative arrangement were not

spelled out by Egyptian Foreign Minister Mahmoud Fawzi, but he said it would protect both the interests of the cans users and the sovereignty of Egypt.

The idea of a cooperative arrangement was set forth by Fawzi in a 7,000-word speech in which he proposed creation of a negotiating committee to seek a solution. The cooperative arrangements, he said, would be one of the objectives.
