Egypt, Russia Reject Suez Plan

Offered by Britain, France

Called for Negotiations On Canal Operation

United Nations, N.Y., Oct. 8 (AP)—Egypt and Russia today rejected the British-French proposal to establish a cooperative arrangement for the operation of the canal.

Both told the U.N. Security Council that it is hopeless to seek a solution on the basis of the international control proposal backed by Britain and France.

Details of the proposed cooperative arrangement were not spelled out by Egyptian Foreign Minister Mahmoud Fawzi, but he said it would protect both the interests of the canal users and the sovereignty of Egypt.

The idea of a cooperative arrangement was set forth by Fawzi in a 7,000-word speech in which he proposed creation of a negotiating committee to seek a solution. The cooperative arrangement, he said, would be one of the objectives.

Fawzi criticized Britain and France for their handling of the Suez question, but for the most part his speech was mild and conciliatory.

Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko quickly lined up behind Fawzi in favor of the establishment of a negotiating committee. He suggested that the committee might consist of either six or eight countries.

Salome of 1908 Passes at 70

Los Angeles, Oct. 8 (AP)—Maud Allan, the controversial dancer who shocked the world nearly 50 years ago with her portrayal of a disabled Salome pantomimically cymbal, died yesterday at a rest home.

Miss Allan, best known for nearly two years, died yesterday at a rest home.

Canadian-born, Miss Allan created a sensation when in 1908 she appeared at London's Palace Theatre, clad in diaphanous veils to dance her "Vision of Salome."

She was a dancer in a theatrical dancing troupe, but she was modest compared with today's public and fan dancers. She always detested her dancer as pure art.

Her dancing career ended in 1933 when she was seriously hurt in an auto accident. She recovered, to write an autobiography and to engage with her former partner in a disabled Salome pantomimically cymbal.

Two physicians, Dr. William Allan and Dr. Label Hutchinson, Allan's family moved to California.

Miss Allan at first studied piano, but later switched to dancing while in London.

From then until 1917, her years of greatest success — Miss Allan traveled all over the world. In some cities, authorities refused to allow her to dance, but in general she received wide critical acclaim.

Her husband, James M. Allan, died in World War II, later returning her to work for a while as an aircraft company as a draftsman.

The Barriers Not Physical

The Manchester-Rockville Committee for Employment of the Handicapped, under the chairmanship of Wells Denison, is marking the local observance of the National Employ the Physically Handicapped Week, proclaimed by President Eisenhower. And this committee is activating itself not merely as an agency for educational effort, but also as a working body, which is actually working the special time of its members in the practical business of using this period to put handicapped people to work, and not merely talk about it.

There are two great barriers to employment of the physically handicapped, and neither is physical. Both, rather, are psychological. The first barrier is usually located in the mind of the employer. The second barrier, also mental, is located in the mind of the prospective employee. One may think that he has no job which would be suitable, or who, perhaps, would rather just mope together with any element of human tragedy.

But, if both the handicapped and their potential employer will pay attention to it, there is already enough proof on record to dispel both psychological barriers. The proof, both in special experimental dealing solely with handicapped workers, and in the routine inclusion of handicapped workers in regular industries not specially arranged for them, shows that the handicapped produce, that they produce safety, that they produce the best of all employees, and that the dividend, both for them and for the employer, also includes the satisfaction that comes in living and in helping, the re-birth of an individual.

If you are handicapped, and unemployed, register with the state employment service. If you see an employer with an opening, break out of the psychological barriers and face demoralized reality. If you have an idea, and want help with it, contact Mr. Denison and his committee.

Truman On Bomb Tests
Our suspicion that it may be actual Stevenson who is scoring, and who deserves to score, in this campaign points with his recommendation that this country take the lead in negotiating an end of hydrogen bomb tests in the name of the identity of the Democrat who has now joined President Eisenhower in scoring this suggestion.

It is possible, of course, to be right, and still have Harry Truman on your side. But it takes a awful lot of being right to withstand the shock of having Harry agree with you, and President Eisenhower does not have an awful lot of being right on the bomb test issue.
