Hamilton Standard Aids Community Fire Protection

Fire is a common enemy in the home and on the job. Every member of the community has a duty to do his part both in preventing fire and, if needed, in

A highly-trained, well-equipped 20-man fire department stands ready at Hamilton Standard's Windsor Locks plant, prepared to assist in emergencies in Windsor Locks, Windsor, Suffield, and East Granby as well as in the plant itself. These nearby towns are within scope of a mutual assistance agreement.

A modern Class A pumper of the type used in many Connecticut towns heads the list of firefighting equipment available at Hamilton Standard. Backing up the full-time Hamilton Standard fire department is a two hundred strong volunteer brigade of employees. These volunteers are trained in weekly drills.

The Hamilton Standard plants at Windsor Locks and Broad Brook, where propellers and equipment for jet aircraft are developed and manufactured, are protected by automatic sprinkler heads in one of the heaviest concentrations in use anywhere. More than 12,000 sprinkler heads guard against fire. Firemen and equipment are assigned to stand by when any hazard is foreseen, such as in handling of flammable materials, welding or open flame operations, and in the arrival or departure of aircraft on the taxiway to Bradley Field.


