Jury Retires Nuclear Test Ban Urged In \$150,000 By U.S. Scientist Group

Rockyille, Oct. 25 (Special)

A jury of six men and aix women retired before non today to deliberate testimony heard in a \$150,000 damage suit brought by an Andover couple against firms laying a natural gas pipeline in 1801.

The case, being heard in Toliand County Superior Court was initiated by Leo and Zinaldia I. Nelson, Andover, against Ford. Bacon and Davis, Inc., and the Algonquin Gas and Transmission Co.

During eight days of testimony, the Nelsons claim they were forced to sell at a loss a chicken breeding business they operated on Bunker Hill in Andover, because of blasting done in the laying of a natural gas pipeline on their property in 1981.

They claim that some 78 blasts were set off, killing 174 chickens, and causing loss of weight, in others, reducing their egg production, Ford, Bacon and Davis were engineers for the Algonquin Co.
