least element, an alkaline earth metal. Radioactive Strontium-90 is dangerous because, like ordinary calcium, it can go to the bones. And it stays active for an average of 40 years.

If animals are given too much of the element, it produces cancer of the bones.

Q. Have dangerous amounts of Strontium been created and distributed on earth?

A. The AEC says the amount falling from all tests to date would have to be increased "many thousands times" before any effect on humans would be noticeable. The Willard Libby of the AEC estimates that even if 11,000 bombs were exploded—each one of them equal to a one-megaton H-bomb—it would be hard to prove statistically that any of the Strontium had caused bone tumors in any one. (A megaton is equal to one million tons of TNT).

The National Academy of Sciences, an independent scientific agency, says some children now have detectable amounts in their bones but that it is only 1/1000th of what is considered a permissible safe dose.

Other scientists say there is no question but that Strontium is dangerous, and that the critical question is exactly how much it had, and how close it was to that point, or will be in the future.

Q. Can Strontium-90 be absorbed by plants and animals and thus enter human bodies through vegetables, meats, and milk?

A. Yes.

Q. What's the hazard from this so far?

A. Dr. Libby's studies indicate that cow's milk contains only one-tenth of the Strontium-90 that is in the cow's feed. Plants absorb only some of the fall-out Strontium, he says, and animals do not retain all that they might get from contaminated plants.

Also Created by A-Bombs

Q. Is Strontium-90 formed only in H-bombs?

A. No. It is created by atom bombs when Uranium or Plutonium atoms split. Atom bombs or reactions are used in each H-

bomb, as the "trigger" to create heat and temperature to make the hydrogen bomb go off. So any H-bomb forms some Strontium, too, depending on how big an A-bomb reaction was used as the trigger.

It is quite possible that so-called super-H-bombs or a large more Strontium. Some scientists speculate that the super-H-bomb gets its extra power from being surrounded by a jacket of ordinary Uranium. This extra Uranium could yield extra amounts of Strontium. But the AEC has never confirmed or denied that H-bombs, or some of them, are constructed in this way.

Q. Would halting H-bomb tests halt production of Strontium-90?

A. No. A-bomb weapons would have to be banned also.

Q. Do H-bombs produce more Strontium than A-bombs?

A. Apparently they can, though the AEC has never detailed this in general tables. That A-bombs produce more or less depends on the size or yield of the bomb, the height at which it exploded, what it made of, and how many different isotopes of Strontium it picks up, and makes radioactive.

Q. Can fall-out from H-bombs be reduced?

A. The AEC says that spring tests in the Pacific tested ways to localize fall-out. It was not as extensive as that, and does not begin testing, we will add dangerous amounts of radioactivity to our world.

The AEC and President Eisenhower have been developing new weapons for defense, with less fall-out hazard, and providing Civil Defense. The amount of fall-out from our own tests, and other nations, is being reduced.

Q. How is fall-out broadcast?

A. Heavy particles soon drop to earth. In the test site, lighter ones float in the lower atmosphere. The amount of fall-out is a bell of latitude several times in a few weeks before drifting to

Tests Provide Clues

Q. How can nuclear fallout in foreign countries be detected?

A. By air sampling at government stations and other means not described for security reasons. Fall-out gives clues to the type and strength of the weapon tested. It can be detected by instruments that learn whether it was violating an agreement not to test?

Q. Many atomic scientists say yes at least for all but the smallest-power ones, and that the advantages gained by a single test cannot be very great.

The AEC says detection systems cannot measure picking up every test, and that learning the size and nature of weapons, particularly with the larger, more complex weapons.

Q. Have we learned enough from our tests, or built up our nuclear arsenal enough to stop testing?

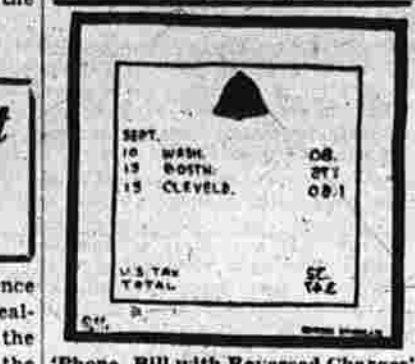

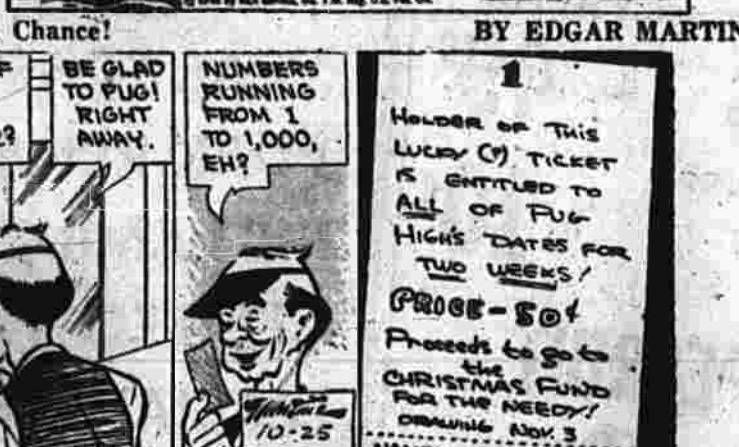

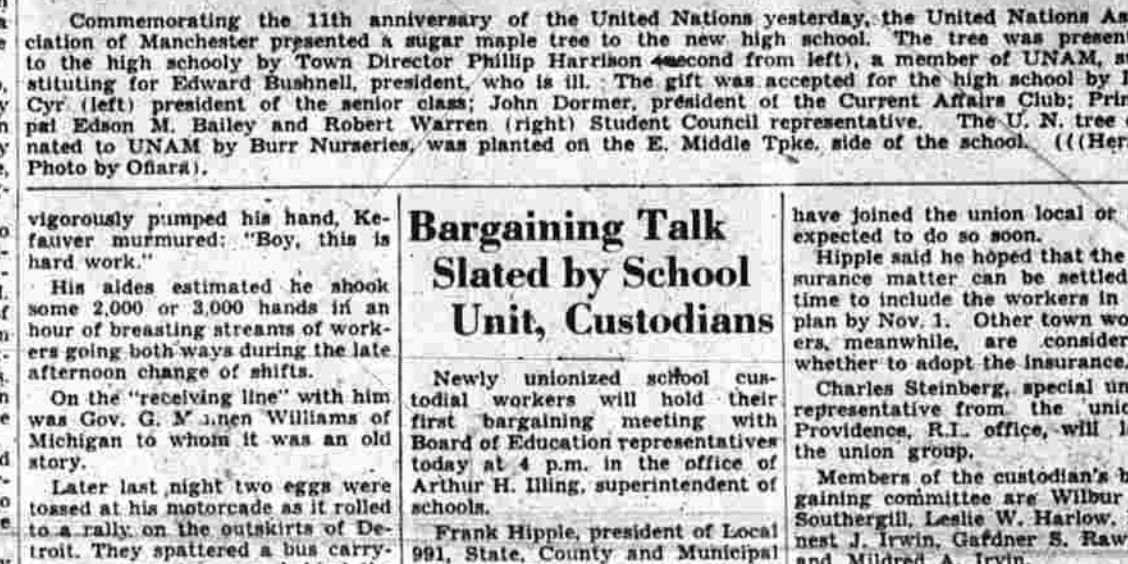

Nixon Claims Ike Best Bet For 'Rights'

Chicago, Oct. 25 (AP)—Vice President Nixon said today the Eisenhower administration will deliver on its pledges to broaden civil rights but that an Adlai Stevenson administration would be unable to do so.

That is the case, he said in a speech prepared for a rally here, "because the Republican party is solidly united behind the President's program" on civil rights while the Democrats are split into two warring camps on the issue.

He said that every candidate for the House and Senate, Republican and Democrat, should state before election day whether he favors the Eisenhower proposal for disarming, which insists on inspection of the Stevenson proposals which provide for stopping government contracts, and laying the legal groundwork for integration of public schools with "considerable progress" toward that goal.
