Israel Claims Gains In Sinai Peninsula

Paris, Nov. 1 (P)-French and British aircraft carriers moved toward the Suez Canal today, bearing down on the waterway from both north and south, a French Defense Ministry communique said.

There was no indication whether any troop transports accompanied the carriers and the Defense Ministry did not specify the number of naval units involved.

London, Nov. 1 (P)-British and French planes carried on nonstop attacks on Egyptian airfields today and Cairo announced attacking aircraft sank an Egyptian warship in the Suez Canal-blocking traffic and cutting off oil shipping to Europe.
