much of it on legislation dealing with flood control and insurance. Connecticut became vitally concerned about the problem after the 1955 floods.

Incidentally, the few angry exchanges between the two rivals, both generally well-mannered, have been over Bush's Senate record.

Dodd has charged that Bush has been claiming credit that doesn't belong to him. His rival, Dodd says, has the "curious habit of attaching his name to every bit of legislation he thinks has voting pulling power in Connecticut."

"It wouldn't surprise him, continued Dodd, to learn the Declaration of Independence referred to as the Bush-Jefferson Declaration of Independence."

Bush contends it's common practice to attach the names of Senators and Representatives to bills with which they are closely identified. He retorted:

"Mr. Dodd is quibbling like a lawyer, seeking to harass a witness. If he had his way, we could refer to the Labor Management Relations Act as the Hart-Hartley Act."

Tolland County Superior Court

Rockville, Nov. 2 (Special)—Defendants against whom a \$15,000 judgment was entered in Tolland County Superior Court last week have filed motions to set aside the verdict.

The motion was filed by Ford Bacon, and David and the Alcorn Gas and Transmission Co. as a result of a suit brought by George and Zinaida I. Nelson, Ansonia, to recover damages from a dynamite blasting in 1931.

In the original suit, the plaintiffs asked for \$150,000 as a result of the explosion, which occurred when the dynamite being used for a natural gas well exploded.

The blasting according to the Nelsons killed or otherwise affected their children, forcing the plaintiffs out of business.

Action on the motion was scheduled for a date, calendar session today, but was postponed.

Other cases at the session today were disposed of as follows:

Edward P. Richards, formerly of Ellington, was charged with \$1,000 bond by Superior Court Judge Howard W. Alcorn for a violation of the law on the second Tuesday of January, the beginning of the winter season.

Richards was arrested last night on a bench warrant arising out of a complaint from his wife, who said he had been drinking and driving on the road.

Robert A. Newberry, Coventry, divorced from Eleanor M. Newberry, also of Coventry, was ordered to pay support of \$16 a week for each of three children and \$175 court costs.

Robert Freeman, 57, Woodstock, former Western Union station agent here, and convicted Nov. 8, 1934, of embezzlement, was ordered to make restitution of \$1,153.33 to the American Surety Co., which paid Western Union when the embezzlement was discovered.

Freeman was sentenced to a year at Tolland County Jail and six months later, in May, 1935, was released on two years' probation, which he is now serving.

Three other domestic cases were over: They were Fred A. Stockwell vs. Frances Anna Stockwell, where judgment is against Elizabeth A. Neelans vs. Roy E. Neelans, judgments for \$1,000 each, vs. Angelo L. Boas; custody and support, almost while the case is in court and counsel fees.

A default against the defendant for failure to appear was granted in the case of Michael J. Bunta, et al, vs. Clifford E. Smith. A motion for production and inspection by plaintiff's counsel, Active, Gryk and Gryk, Manchester, was denied in the case of Norman C. Church, et al, vs. Norman C. Church, et al.
