

\$100,000 Fire Follows Blast At Gas Plant

Mayville, Ky., Nov. 13 (AP)—Fire that raged through a bulk gasoline storage plant here for several hours was brought under control early today, Mayville police reported.

It could not be ascertained immediately if anyone had been injured in the blaze at the Texaco Distributing Co. plant.

Three companies fought the blaze which police said broke out about 11 o'clock last night, following an explosion of unknown cause.

Milton C. Russell, president and owner of the company, estimated loss at \$100,000 if all the tanks were lost.

Two truck drivers, R. M. Boy, 38, and Waid Colley, both from Columbus, Ohio, said they were unloading gasoline at the plant when they heard an explosion.

Colley said "I just started running" Boy jumped into his truck and drove it out with flames around it. He then went back and pulled another trailer out of the line.

He said about two minutes later one light storage tank exploded.

Colley said he heard an explosion at the back of the company office, then heard another louder explosion.

Five of the storage tanks had already been destroyed.

The plant is on the outskirts of town but close to residences.

Russell said 25,000 gallons of gas, 30,000 gallons of oil and 18,000 gallons of kerosene were stored at the plant. He said \$100,000 in tires and three company trucks also were on the grounds.

Victims in the other car were the driver, Bobby Gene Blackman, 26, Oro Grande, Calif., and Arnulfo Chavez, 22, Victorville.

Algiers, Nov. 13 (AP)—Nationalist rebels ambushed two buses east of Oran last night, killing seven Europeans and kidnapping an unknown number of Moslems.

The dead included six soldiers and one civilian. Troops began a widespread search for the rebel band of about 50 men.

Old Tree Displayed

An interesting historical relic is being shown at Douglas Library: a section of a large branch of Hebron's old elm tree, which stood on Hebron Green for 140 years until wind lightning, old age and decay made it necessary to cut it down.

This was done with a telling of the church bells and an appropriate program. The relic is preserved in a double frame, showing the tree section and a small picture of the tree with newspaper clippings on one side.

On the reverse side rings showing the growth of the tree are revealed. These rings are so tiny that this correspondent was unable to count them. The tree was set out in 1783 by David Barber, village tavern keeper. His daughter, Patience helped her father by holding the small tree while he filled it in with earth. She later became the wife of the Hon. Sylvester Gilbert, a member of Congress.

The elm was cut down in 1904. A picture of the tree appears in the book.
