### Canadian Scientists Tackling Problem of Defense in Arctic

Ottawa, Nov. 19 (AP)—Development of a defense in the Arctic to enable ground radar installations in the Arctic to detect ice. Experiments are being made on de-icing equipment for aircraft engines from the Arctic region.

Valentin and Gisela Kahlaus tucked their "cowboy" son Rene into bed after a hard day riding the rails. The refugee family came here recently under the Displaced Persons Act.

He says he might be the spariest in the class if he knew English. He and his parents seem delighted with the friendliness of Americans and the open feeling of the countryside, even though they have only seen parts of Connecticut on route from New York to Manchester.

Now already has made friends with a little boy down the street, and is enthused at being in the native country of the Lone Ranger.

Valentin and his wife are full of plans to "get their feet on the ground." Both seem inclined to punch themselves to see if all this is real.

They are reluctant to discuss present day German politics beyond saying the West German leader Konrad Adenauer is very popular. But "he is old," they say. German credit him with getting the prisoners of war back from Russia, a popular step.

They say the border between the Germanys is Germany— which includes the area where they lived since their marriage, and the Russian zone, has been relatively open for some time.

Refugees by the thousands have come through this area, trying to escape from the distressed areas to the east. Many of these people had hard sledding, even though they gained freedom, the Kahlaus say.

Holiday Explained

Valentin and his wife arrived here at a time when Americans are getting ready to observe Thanksgiving holiday.

They say they are familiar with similar holidays observed in Europe to celebrate harvest time, but the European festivals are not the times of merry making, while our American Thanksgiving is more symbolic of religious gratitude.

After the differences were pointed out to them one evening recently, both agreed their hearts would be full Nov. 22. Probably the pilgrims felt the same way.

### Letter from Kang: Korea Orphan Pens His Foster Parents

 Coventry, Nov. 16 (Special)—Kang Huk Koo, 16, of the Coventry Orphan Society, has recently received two letters from his adopted Korean foster parents, Kang Hak Koo, who has been cared for by the club for the past several years.

Kang is about 13 now and expects to leave grammar school, which he refers to as "primary school," next year.

An August letter sent to Mrs. C. Irving Loomis, project secretary, reads as follows: "Dear My Foster Mother: I have received the letter which you sent me the other day, and I was very happy. As from 28th July I have now got into school. The weather is so hot that it is very hard to attend the school, and when my vacation has begun my happy feeling is almost hard to express to you. But, dear my mother, I am very busy because I wish to finish my home work. As the wings of insects are we by working from it is very easy to capture them in the morning. We have been suffering from mosquito which is estimated so numerous that it is of no use to scatter oil DDT. Soon I will write the letter again. Goodbye.

"Yours lovingly, Kang Huk Koo."

The second letter, dated September 1956, reads as follows: "Dear Foster Parents in Coventry: I was very happy to receive a letter from you and enjoyed it so much. On 4th July we also celebrated our Independence Day. It is cool autumn already in Korea. I am studying hard at school. The primary school now I am attending is 'Young Primary School'. After one year I shall enter a middle school. Our school has 500 students and its building is a nice 2-story house. It also has a large and wonderful play yard. We are studying about national language, mathematics, studies of social life, fine arts, etc. In the hour for drawing we went out to the beach and drew a picture of boats on the sea. In summertime a cool breeze comes from the sea, therefore we do not feel the hot weather so much. Although a wind comes from the sea in the wintertime too, it is not so cold in our place. All the children in our orphanage are 150 but now here

### John Testifies He Foiled Reds

Karlsruhe, Germany, Nov. 18 (AP)—Dr. Otto John testified today that the Russians did not break me down, but in order to prevent that, I had to go along with them.

John, former chief of West Germany's Intelligence Bureau, is on trial before the Federal Supreme Court here on charges of treasonable relations with the East.

On cross-examination, John said he was never "in direct physical danger, but I was facing threats and I knew from reports what the

Russians had done with the Catholics and the strongest of men."

He made the statement when he was asked to explain statements he made in a new conference, radio talks and in the Communist press while he was in East Germany.

"I do not understand it all myself," he said. "I simply did not have time to think it out."

Dr. Franz Mühlentatter, chief deputy of the West German Criminal Investigation Bureau testified "we never considered it a possibility that the country's top intelligence and criminal chiefs would ever be kidnapped by the East."

Mühlentatter said that it was more or less considered a "point of honor" between the East and West

that top men would not be kidnapped.

The government claims that John defected to the East July 20, 1954, and leaked state secrets to the Soviets. John who returned 17 months later, testified that he was drugged and abducted to East Berlin where he was held by the Soviets.

Testifying in John's behalf, Mühlentatter said that agents in the criminal investigation bureau were under instructions to use coded letters to inform the outside if they were captured and held in the East.

A witness testified earlier that John advised his wife and his office by coded letters that he was held against his will.

Speaking about his plans, Bailey said, "There's about 167 million people in this country today. More than ever before. More people means more Christmas mail. That's why it's so important to have a helping hand from the public to Mail Early For Christmas. He especially directed his appeal to the lady of the house because she usually selects the Christmas cards, buys most of the gifts, and sees to it that the Christmas mailing list is up-to-date.

"Predicting that this year's Christmas mail will set a new all-time record, Bailey urged that you take the following steps at once: Check your Christmas card lists very carefully to make sure that each address includes the full name, street, and number, city, zone and state. Then, secure Pamphlet No. 2 at the Post Office, telling you all about packaging and wrapping parcels for mailing, and Pamphlet No. 3, giving full details on domestic postage rates and fees. Stock up on stamps at the same time.

"Also, ask for free labels reading 'All For Local Delivery' and 'All For Out of Town Delivery,' so that you can speed arrival of your Christmas cards by sorting and tying them in two separate bundles with the addresses all facing one way.

"A modest investment in heavy wrapping paper, sturdy cellophane, string, cord, and craft paper adhesive tape will pay big dividends in safe deliveries of your cherished Christmas gifts.

"If you'd like to include your Christmas cards or letters inside the packages with your gifts, just add the appropriate first class postage to the postage for the packages. This country's new mail service insure simultaneous arrival of your gifts and greetings.

### Red, Laotian Pact Fails to Unsettle U.S.

Bangkok, Thailand, Nov. 18 (AP)—American sources here say the agreement recently reached between the Royal Laotian government and the Communist-United Front forces is not as ominous as it might seem.

Informants just back from Laos say there appears to be a deep-seated animosity toward neighboring Red China, which Laotians associate with the Pathet Lao and invading Vietminh forces during the Indochina war.

Tired of Expat War

The settlement, which will be the result of a gradual tiring of a "dirty little war," these sources added, they expressed belief the government now has a better chance to keep an eye on the Communist threat.

The political activity of Pathet Laos will be confined to the northern provinces of Pong Saly and Sam Neua, where they have been fighting.

Coolness toward China is long standing in Laos. As everywhere else in Southeast Asia, Chinese control the business and economy, something which always grates on the local populace.

U.S. officials are hoping to correct what now appears to be an imbalance in the allocation of aid to Laos. Of an estimated \$50 million being given to the country, 40 million is for expenditures on its 25,000 man army. These officials said there would be an attempt made to build up small industry and improve the agricultural methods of the country.

Laos, a nation of three million, is plagued by spiraling inflation in which the people get about 33 cents value out of every dollar. The market rate is 96 to 1. In fact, the government has such little faith in its currency that, so one, including Laos national, can use the national currency for anything. Potential passengers must use foreign currency.

### Justice Dickenson Succumbs at 76

Wethersfield, Nov. 18 (AP)—Retired Justice Edwin Cole Dickenson of the Connecticut Supreme Court died at his home yesterday.

Justice Dickenson, appointed to the State's highest court in 1942 by Democratic Gov. Robert A. Hurley, retired six years ago. He was appointed to the bench to succeed Justice Christopher L. Avery, a graduate of the Yale Law School in 1902. Justice Dickenson began a career as a judge in 1918 when he was appointed to the Hartford police court bench. He had served as prosecuting attorney in that court from 1907 to 1911.

He was recognized by the Hartford County Bar Assn. as having "splendid judicial temperament" when the association urged his appointment in 1925 to the superior court. He held that post 17 years.

He moved to the superior court from the common pleas court in 1929.

Justice Dickenson was born in Cromwell, but when he was a year old his family moved to Hartford. Before starting his long career on the bench, Justice Dickenson was a member of the Common Council of Hartford from 1914 to 1916. He also served as vice president of the court.

Justice Dickenson leaves his widow, the former Florence Louise Blood, and two sisters, Mrs. William A. Shaw of Wethersfield and Mrs. George L. Siederberg of Groton.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday with burial in Berlin.

By JAMES MARLOW Washington, Nov. 18 (AP)—No two men ever tried harder than Adlai Stevenson and Estes Kefauver to shake hands over the lead to high office. But the human hand never looked more useless than it did in the 1956 presidential campaign. They put up perhaps the biggest handshaking campaign in political history—thanks to all the ways they had for getting around—and both wound up losing the election, their own states and even their own counties. If they had never shaken a hand they could hardly have made out worse. They could not even offer the public satisfaction with President Eisenhower, who spent practically no time shaking hands with individuals in connection with his talking in a few speeches to the biggest crowds that could be assembled. Eisenhower had demonstrated in the New Hampshire Republican primary of 1956 when he lost a candidate do not have to make a single speech or shake hands with one voter if his popularity and prestige are high enough. Perhaps next time the Democrats will put less value on personal meetings with candidates and individual voters and more on getting a more complete idea of the voters' feelings. But there's no evidence he added anything to Eisenhower's victory.

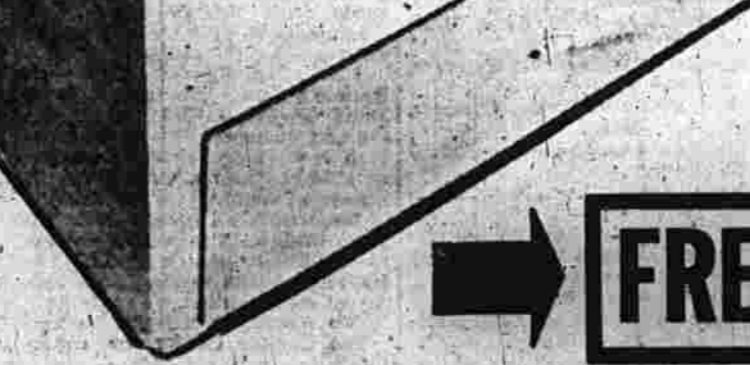
