Hungary for Lag's Visit Later Britain, France to Push Poland Again Refuses U.N. Plea on Observers

Budapest, Dec. 3 (AP)—An official spokesman of the government of Janos Kadar reluctantly admitted today that Hungarians had been deported to the Soviet Union.

The dramatic admission was made by Istvan Szilard, press chief of the government, to a group of five western reporters in the tank-surrounded Budapest Parliament building.

Szilard also conceded that "scattered armed bands" were remaining in Hungary, that public security was not yet restored in the capital and that Hungarian mines were producing only a third of their pre-revolution output.

United Nations, N.Y., Dec. 3 (AP)—Hungary today refused once more to permit U.N. observers to enter Hungary, it told Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold, however, that he would be welcomed in Budapest "at a later date."
