

To the contrary, they would welcome the idea that such a ruling for other localities might change more contacts and more industrial expansion into Connecticut.

Refugee Funds Asked by Area Red Cross Head

Columbia, Dec. 4 (Special)—Roland Laramie, chairman of the Columbia Chapter of the American Red Cross, announced yesterday that the local chapter has been asked by national headquarters to take part in a campaign for \$500,000 for Hungarian relief.

Residents of Andover, Columbia and Hebron, which the Columbia Chapter serves, are asked to mail contributions to Roland Laramie, Columbia Chapter of the American Red Cross, P.O. Box 117, Columbia.

Laramie's announcement was made following receipt of a letter of appeal from E. Roland Harlan, chairman of the National Red Cross.

In his communication to the local chapter, Harlan said that the suffering of the people of Hungary has caused every American to want to send help. This help, he said, is not only in the form of money but also in the form of clothing and other necessities to the Red Cross.

He continued, "The Red Cross is the international agency that is now moving supplies into Hungary and supervising their distribution. As refugees pour into Austria, government turned to the Red Cross to accept responsibility for the refugees. It is reported that more than 85,000 refugees have already crossed over the Hungarian border, and daily additional numbers pour into Austria.

"The needs continue to mount in Hungary, as well as among the refugees who have escaped. The Red Cross must have additional funds to help meet the increasing need for food, medical supplies, clothing and other essentials.

"American everywhere will be glad to help. The Red Cross is assisting Hungarian refugees.

Connecticut Yankee By A. H. O.

Certain things concerning Clara Booth Luce are inevitable. One is that whenever she is unoccupied, as she soon will be as she completes her service as ambassador to Italy, there is bound to be wonder and speculation over the possibility of a new political role for her in Connecticut.

A second certainty is that she herself will be at least tentatively and provisionally interested. And if the situation should seem propitious as time goes along, the heavy probabilities are that she would commit herself fully to some very new Connecticut role.

All of us have not quite in this age of suffrage come to the realization that woman, as well as man, can prove a political animal. But the truth is, we think, that human nature is the same in both sexes, and that human nature, once incited with the virus of public service and public role, recovers very rarely.

The fair lady's last venture into Connecticut politics came in 1952, when she sought the Senate nomination for the 1st district. She had little realistic chance, that time, of upsetting the trend toward Bush, but what made news about her attempt was the vigorous nature of her commitment to it. This vigor reached its behind the scenes climax in a piece of paper which would be considered quite a document if it could be obtained, said paper purportedly containing a message from her gallant husband to the Connecticut legislature.
