London, Dec. 6 (P)—Prime Minister Eden's chief deputy, A. Butler, told the House of Commons today the reins of the British government will be "handed back" to Eden immediately on his return from his Jamaican rest cure. Butler's statement, however, did nothing to lessen speculation that Eden soon may be forced to re-

Butler said Eden "would wish to face the music" — a reference to the controversy racing in Britain over his Suez invasion policies. Vote Due Tonight

The House votes tonight on a confidence motion which, if not carried, could force Eden's cabinet to quit. The government is expected to win on the confidence motion, but Britain's big newspapers split about evenly on Eden's chances of continuing to hold his

Three nationally distributed dailies said Eden is finished and will have to make way for another conservative prime minister to give the party a new lease on political life.

Three other papers thought Eden would hold on. One said may be could, and another—the Times of London - voiced no opinion.

As Commons went into the closing round of debate on the Suez invasion, the conservatives closed ranks in preparation for the vote of confidence on the wisdom of the military venture and the current withdrawal from the Suez

Washington, Dec. 6 (AP)— The United States bitterly protested to Russia today against the use of Soviet military force against "help-

less civilians" in Hungary, The protest was based directly on a report that a line of Russian tanks drew up on the sidewalk in front of the U.S. legation in Budapest with guns turned on Hungar-ian demonstrators and thereby prevented their approaching the building.

"Using the figure of \$1,900 per pupil, the committee estimated that a 6-year Junior-Senior High School built to accommodate 500 pupils would cost approximately on a 29-year basis, it would mean that the cost to the town would be \$47,500 yearly. State grants would approximate one-third this cost, but would practically be dissipated by the interest charge on the bond issue."
