700 Inrate Taxpayers Baffled By Interim 21-Mill Tax Bill

"Where I worked in Hungary (Hungarian industrial works in Budapest) only the set-up men were paid by the hour. All the workers were paid by piece work. If at the end of a day you didn't get anything," Petrovics said, "if they told you to do it, you did it."

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16 in Race Violence To Face U.S. Judge

Alonso Bullock, an unemployed preacher, William Brackbill, service station operator, Clifford Carter, unemployed laborer, and Jimmy Pierce, a teenager who dropped out of Clinton High in October.

Their bonds were set at sums ranging from \$2,500 for Carter to \$12,000 for Bill Brantley, who was released in \$10,000 paid by two Knoxville couples.

Those facing arraignment today were Zella Nason, Thomas R. Sanders, Hanson Nelson, Clyde Cook, Chas. Nelson, Chris Foust, John B. Long, J. C. Cooley and Raymond Wood.

All were charged in the warrants with "one or more" of a long list of alleged violations of the court's order forbidding anyone in Anderson County from doing anything which might tend to cause interference with peaceful integration of the school.

These included "violence toward Negro students," a campaign of intimidation against school officials, "joining a White Citizens' Council," and "preventing the effectiveness of integration."

"Threats of violence," "hickering and congregating (near) the school building," "entering the school on intimidation purposes," "instigating acts of violence (by) white students," "acts of assault and battery against Negro students on their way home from school or against white persons accompanying Negro students."

The warrants charged that these acts had "created a condition of lawlessness... of such dangerous and intolerable character as to force the closing of the school."

The federal officer who arrested 771 said the council chairman was armed with a pistol.

"At his arraignment," he said, "when a strange car comes up to my yard, I always carry a pistol. I had no intention of using it."

He said the council had been trying to keep peace, and "we have had nothing to do with any of that trouble."

Pierce admitted being in the school Tuesday but denied charges of threatening a teacher after the judge said: "I'm concerned about your going into the school, and threatening a teacher. That's a serious matter."

Carter, Bullock and Cook were accused of being in the group which attacked the Rev. Mr. Turner. Cook already was under state assault charges in the incident and was free under \$50 bond.

Eden stepped out, but there was some feeling he was too closely identified with a backer of the Convention.

He added that he supported the policy of the African-Asian nations on Egypt "for an immediate withdrawal of British-French forces, with the United Nations supervising their withdrawal and helping clean up the canal."

The smiling Chinese leader obviously enjoyed his trip through India as part of his 7-nation tour of Asia, expressed his views at his first press conference since he arrived in India Nov. 28.

Chou's journey has found him in the role of a polite visitor, especially in a friendly and open atmosphere. His statements have been pitched in a friendly-winning key and he has made no attempt to arouse anti-western sentiment.

Chou made a direct reply to a question about 10 American still in Chinese jails. Asked to comment on Indian Minister V. K. Krishna Menon's remark in New York that he would not be surprised to see the Americans renege on the Chinese Premier's promise to send the Chinese Premier to India.

Mr. Menon always has optimistic hopes. Then he added, "Mr. Menon is a very good friend of ours in the work for world peace."

Chou held his surprise press conference in the shade of a 900-year-old Hindu temple on the shores of the Bay of Bengal, 40 miles south of here.

The Doctor Says

A correspondent writes that she has a 10-month-old son who has a slight head bulge and that she has diagnosed an hydrocephalus.

The boy can't walk, play patty-cake and do many things that average children do. Her request is for a discussion of this subject.

Hydrocephalus is the medical name for a condition—not too common—involving the accumulation of fluid inside the skull. This results in a stretching of the skull from the pressure of excessive fluid. It is commonly called "water on the brain" and may be present at birth or may not become evident until some time during early childhood.

When found at birth, the cause may be some obstruction to the drainage of fluid from the spaces which lie between portions of the brain. What causes this obstruction, however, usually cannot be discovered. Occasionally, the increase in fluid may enlarge the head before birth, thus making childbirth difficult.

Hydrocephalus does not necessarily interfere with intelligence. In one famous case, a man lived to the age of 29 with a skull stretched so much it was almost transparent. His mental faculties, however, remained excellent.

The symptoms of hydrocephalus vary widely. Mental changes may or may not be present. Headaches and disturbances in walking or walking are among the possible symptoms.

The outlook for someone afflicted by this condition depends on the cause (if known) and on the speed with which fluid accumulation is arrested. If the condition and fluid accumulates rapidly, the outlook is unfavorable in many mild cases, however, recovery can, and often does, occur. In some cases, the condition can be permanently relieved by surgical and vigorous treatment. In all cases, relief may be obtained by removing through a needle some of the excess fluid. 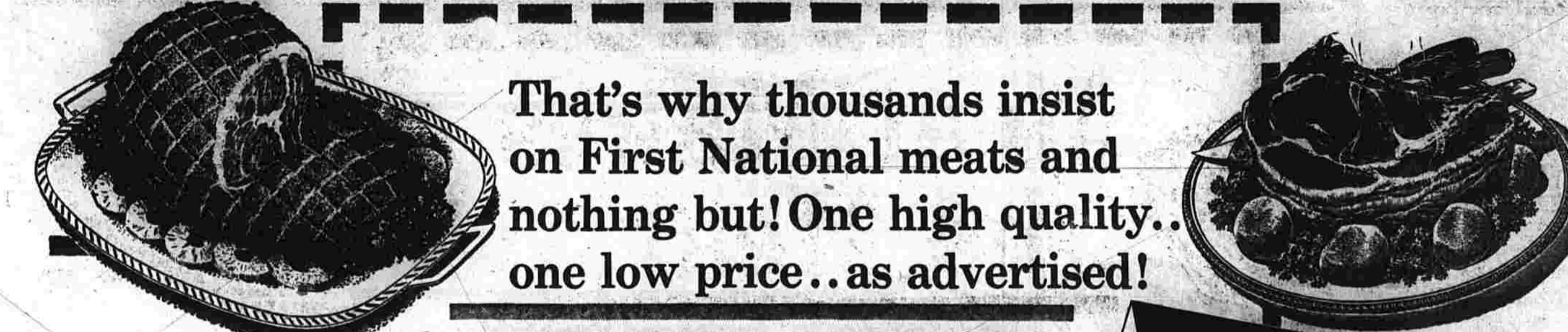

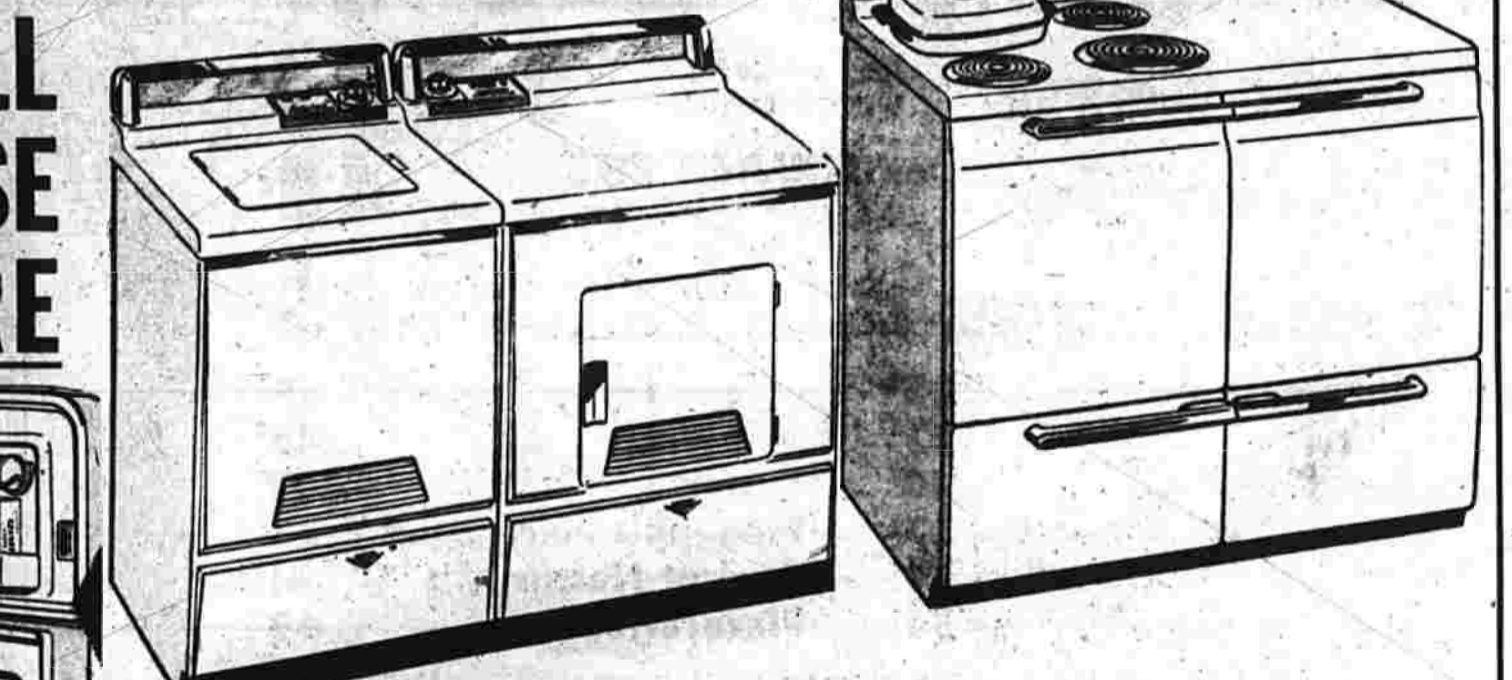
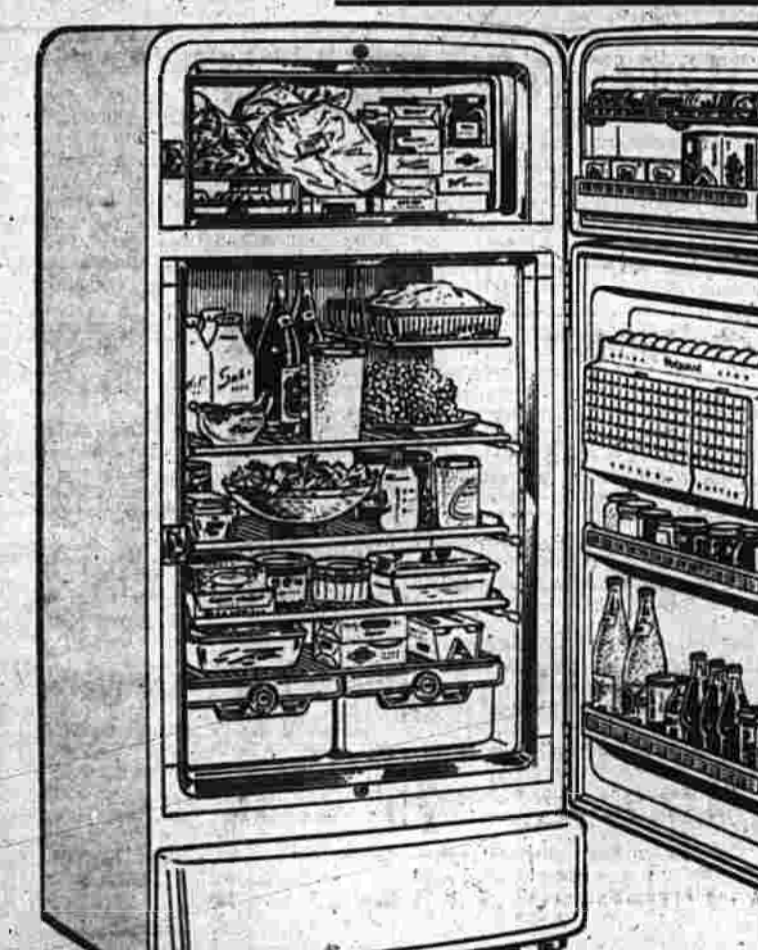
