Mrs. Phillips' Will Bequeaths \$2,000 to Church, Library

Coventry, Dec. 12 (Special)—A total of \$11,000 has been bequeathed to four institutions and a cemetery here and in Mansfield. The will of Julia M. Phillips, filed in the Probate Court, left \$2,000 each to the Booth-Dimock Memorial Library and First Congregational Church.

Also receiving \$2,000 gifts are Mansfield Center Library and Mansfield Congregational Church. The Atwoodville Cemetery, Mansfield, will receive \$5,000 for its future care.

Mrs. Phillips died March 15, at the age of 72 and was a Mansfield native. She was the former Julia Lilley Crane Macfarlane and the widow of Coventry's former postmaster, Louis M. Phillips.

She and her husband lived in Kingsbury House for the time of their marriage in 1920 until their deaths. Mrs. Phillips was active in the ladies activities and during World War I participated in homefront activities.

Administrator of the estate is the Windham branch, Connecticut Bank and Trust Co.

soil bank base acreage program, would have allotted 51 million acres to corn farmers if the commercial acre, which presently comprises 884 major producing counties in 24 midwestern, eastern and southern states.

The old one-acre formula, which was the program for allotment of only 37,280,000 acres among the same farmers.

The new plan had been advanced because the old one-acre formula in the 1938 farm law, resulted in sharply reduced allotments and widespread overplanting and overproduction.

The only penalty for failing to comply with allotments is loss of eligibility for price supports. Because many growers exceeded their allotments and thus became ineligible for price supports, the old program was widely regarded as ineffective in preventing overproduction and in stabilizing prices.

Benson had indicated clearly he favored the new plan, which Congress wrote into the soil bank law last year with his approval. The opposition was carried by farmers by Humphrey and the National Farmers Union.

Their opposition was centered on the larger allotment formula, but not on a provision that would have given the secretary of agriculture much greater leeway in setting price supports on corn acreage.

Under the old plan which farmers voted to retain, corn must be supported between 75 and 90 percent of parity. Under the new one, the rate would have ranged between 80 and 90 percent.

Parity is a standard for measuring farm prices developed by farmers in relation to their costs.

Benson had announced a 1957 support rate of 82.4 per cent under the old plan and \$1.31 under the new one.

Pressure to devise a new corn program is expected to come from the likelihood that farmers will participate in the soil bank program for corn under the old plan. In order to receive soil bank payments, farmers must plant less than their allotment with allotments set on the low 37-million-acre basis, many farmers would plant more rather than less than their allotments.

Humphrey has suggested that Congress raise the allotment under the old plan to 49 million acres.

To become effective, quotas must be approved by at least two-thirds of the growers. The limit quantities of affected crops which growers may market free of penalties.

British Spur Commercial Atom Power

London, Dec. 12 (AP)—Next Monday, the day gasoline rationing begins for Britain, the government is expected to announce its plans for development of commercial atomic energy.

Here, according to authoritative government sources, are some of the details of the fuel and power. Aubrey Jones, may announce.

15 Stations Set for 1960

The number of nuclear power stations actually to be in operation by 1963 is to be increased to 15. Previous plans called for 12.

The electrical output from each of the first stations will be between 200 and 300 megawatts. Previous estimates had been between 100 and 200 megawatts. A megawatt is a million watts.

Later stations will be even more powerful, with some probably exceeding 500 megawatts in capacity.

By 1963, Britain can expect to be drawing 4,000 megawatts from atomic power stations. Previous estimates had been 2,000 megawatts. The present total national production of electricity is about 20,000 megawatts—roughly a sixth of U.S. production.

Britain's private companies are now being projected to build the bulk of the new nuclear power stations, heretofore a government preserve.

Jones will announce a tremendous increase in government funds to be allocated to the nuclear power program. Previous plans called for an outlay of \$400 million by 1965. Some reports say this figure will increase to more than \$1,200,000,000.

Even before the Suez Canal invasion backfired, cutting off 80 per cent of the nation's oil supply, Britain more than any other country had been turning to the atom to solve its energy needs.

The plan calling for 12 nuclear power plants by 1965 was announced last February.

Colder Hall Station Open

In October 1956, Britain's first full scale atomic power plant was switched on at Colder Hall, England. This plant adds only 46 megawatts to the nation's power grid. However, it costs a full penny, compared to 7 of a penny for electricity produced by hydroelectric plants.

Out of Colder Hall, however, has come knowledge which made possible the tremendous expansion program now expected to announce next week.

U.S. Aide's Views Surprise Arabs

By William L. Ryan (An Associated Press Analyst)

Cairo, Dec. 12 (AP)—American and pro-American Arab leaders surprised today over a U.S. diplomat's view that Britain and France called off their invasion of Egypt primarily because of Soviet threats.

This viewpoint was expressed by C. Douglas Dillon, American ambassador to France, in a recorded interview released in Washington.

Dillon said he thought neither moral suasion nor the pressure of dwindling oil supplies had led Britain and France to call off the invasion. The only new element in the situation at the time, he said, "was those Soviet threats which were very strongly perceived."

He said Premier Bulganin had asserted the Soviet Union was prepared to use Soviet "volunteers" who might be sent here.

The Dillon statement ran counter to what Americans here have been telling the Egyptians, and what many Arab leaders in this area are coming to believe—that the United States primarily was responsible for ending the invasion.

One prominent Arab League source has reported a belief that the Soviet Union was aware from intelligence sources that a ceasefire was due and issued the Bulganin ultimatum in an effort to capture Arab public opinion.

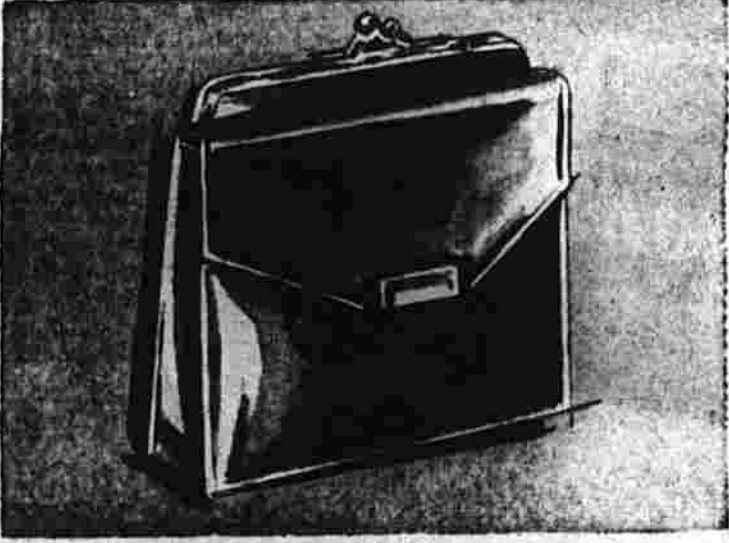

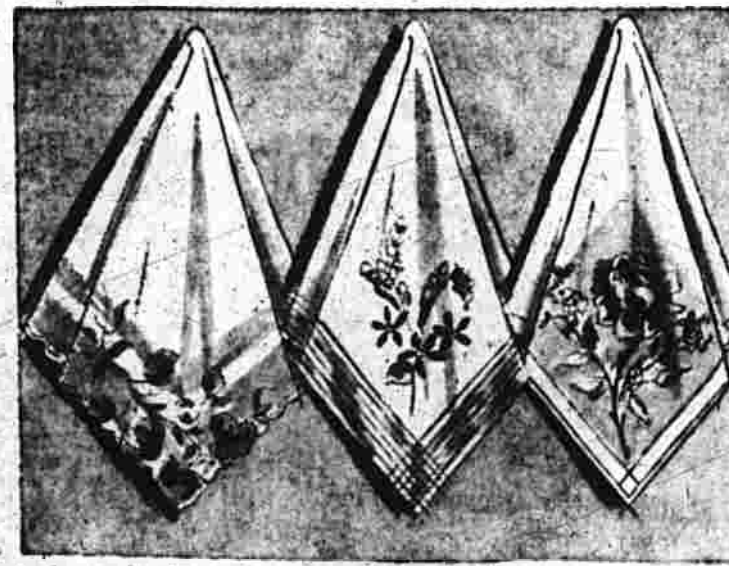

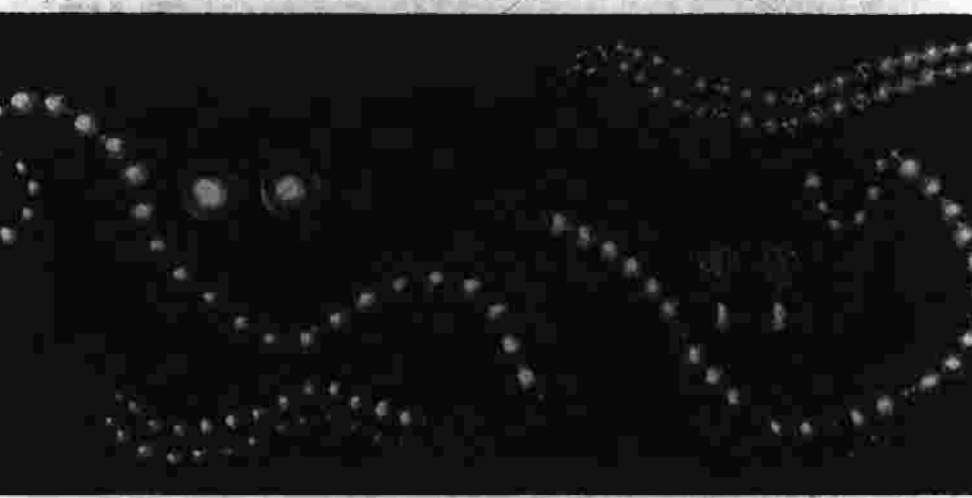

Kubitschek's latest move came in two official orders. He ordered that the Brasilia Airport be ready so that the first mass can be celebrated at the airport Jan. 3. He also ordered that the presidential palace be ready for occupancy within one year.

Reserve Chiefs Back Policy of Tight Money

Washington, Dec. 11 (AP)—The Reserve Board, giving the system's fiscal policies, yesterday endorsed the system's policy of tight money by two Congressional Democrats for action to loosen up credit and let interest rates decline.

William McChesney Martin Jr., chairman of the Federal Reserve Board, gave to immediate effect the Reserve Board's decision to keep the system's policy of tight money. Martin gave his argument that the system follows rather than leads in this department.

Martin asked if reserve officials have "all the tools you need in fighting inflation?"

Martin replied that the board, which is independent of the administration, would not have adequate powers "if the budgetary and fiscal policy of the government ran contrary to it."

Occasional Conflict

There has been occasional conflict between the views of the board and of some members of the administration, but generally the policies of the two groups have meshed.

Martin asked why the reserve system had not made such other self-inflationary moves as changing the required reserve of member banks, recommending higher taxes or national debt reduction or increasing the margin requirements for stock market speculation.

Martin said the reserve board always considered all methods before acting and had decided that "modest adjustments" upward in the discount rate were the best method.

He noted that the reserve banks recently authorized their members to pay up to 2 per cent interest on savings accounts, in an effort to close the gap between savings and credit demands.

"This is an experiment," Martin said, "coming from virtually all sectors of the economy has been an all-time high this year and calls for appropriate action by the reserve system to restrain excessive activity from monetary causes."

Get License Early, MV Head Urges

Hartford, Dec. 12 (Special)—State Motor Vehicles Commissioner John J. Tynan today re-emphasized Connecticut automobile drivers that they should renew their current licenses as early as possible in the month during which their current licenses expire.

"Every month several hundred drivers either forget or neglect to renew their licenses after receiving their renewal forms and notices from the Motor Vehicle Department. This means that they then face the embarrassment and inconvenience of being arrested for driving without a license and of spoiling their otherwise good driving record, all because they didn't renew their licenses in time," the state official said.

"For the convenience of Connecticut drivers, the Motor Vehicle Department sends out license renewal application forms to the drivers in the month of their birthdays, in plenty of time for them to renew their licenses, with envelopes enclosed so that they can get their new licenses by mail without having to go to a departmental office in person.

"In order to avoid any last-minute confusion or delay, we recommend that drivers try to renew their licenses as soon as possible after they receive their renewal applications," Commissioner Tynan said.

Business Boom Faces Test in Coming Year

New York, Dec. 12 (AP)—Two chief supporters of the business boom are heading into testing periods. Consumer spending has been the mainstay of the record prosperity, taking up where government spending left off after the Korean War.

Business expansion has been the extra force which has stretched these good times month after month. Merchants everywhere are seeing a real test of consumer spending moods today, and point to the Christmas selling season. They have large stocks bet on this being their biggest holiday of trade. If it isn't, the January clearance sales should be whoppers.

Car makers here for the national auto show are watching the mood just as closely. They have big large sums on it, too. Their test will come early in New York when their dealers' showrooms fill up with the new models, mostly in short supply.

How the consumer reacts—first to Christmas shopping and later in answering the auto makers' prayers for another big spree of buying of the new models—may give a tip-off whether the business boom is leveling off or just getting set for a new jump forward.

Business expansion plans are also up for a test. So far there has been no slackening. On the contrary, Washington officials look for the first three months of 1957 to set a new peak in spending for new plants, and even more spending for new equipment.

The Commerce Department and the Securities and Exchange Commission look for business spending to reach a record annual rate of \$38 billion in the first quarter, a gain of 8 per cent over the same period of this year. For all of 1956 their estimate is that \$3 billion was spent on business expansion.

The test will come in the next few months, however, in businessmen's future plans. The spending in the next three months is pretty much set by long standing plans. What officials are wondering now is whether this great expansion is for real, or whether announcements of future plans will be as heartening as those of the past—whether some programs may be shelved because of tight money or the international uncertainties.

the consumers' mood and the businessman's decision about future expansion become more apparent. Watch the Christmas trade figures and the car sales figures.

Watch for further industrial expansion announcements, whether they're higher than a year ago or tapered down to a new and sedate pace.

Rockville-Vernon Special Town Meeting Called To Seek Budget Increases

Rockville, Dec. 12 (Special)—A special town meeting has been called for Dec. 26 by the Board of Selectmen at which additional appropriations for the town budget will be asked.

On the diplomatic level, Magloire is angling desperately for official recognition from the United States. It has not been granted. Ambassador Roy Taylor Davis has been called to Washington. Magloire's regime charged yesterday that U.S. government organizations have aggravated conditions by "stirring up the strike." The whole situation stands sharply outlined against one fact: The Haitians are fiercely proud of their independence and their constitution. They won their liberty 132 years ago, in a bloody war with the French, and they will not surrender it without a struggle. Even those who are many—who praise Magloire for his administration in the past six years say they will not permit him to destroy the constitutional process of government.
