28,000 Defying Hungary Reds

Budapest, Dec. 14 (AP)—An estimated 28,000 workers in Hungary's biggest industrial complex—the huge Csepel Iron and Steel Works—south of Budapest—defied Russian tanks and troops today to stage a new sit-down strike. About 80 per cent of the Csepel Works' force of more than 36,000 men walked out today, and dozens other Budapest factories in demanding that workers release the 28,000 strikers. The workers rejected their plan to be refused to produce. At Budapest's biggest electrical products plant, the Belostanska Factory, Csepel workers refused to man their machines in defiance of Russian officers and police who had seized their plant.

New York Firms Hit On Phony Scent Tags

Washington, Dec. 14 (AP)—Three New York City firms were accused by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) today of using French labels to represent domestic perfumes as imported ones.

The commission said the firms labeled their perfumes variously with such names as "Concette Fabrique," "Le Cousturier," "La Vie en Rose," "Quil Suffice," "Blen Venue" and "Parfums." Some of them sometimes are advertised as "from Paris to you," it added.

The FTC complaint does not allege that American perfumes are inferior, but says the public prefers those imported from France and has a right to know what it is buying.

Saar Parties Divided over Coal to Reich

Saarbruecken, Dec. 14 (AP)—The Saarland's separty coalition government split today over the approval of a resolution approving the return of the coal area to Germany on Jan. 1. The resolution was adopted 32-23.

Approval of the resolution led to the resignation of Dr. Heinrich Schneider, president of parliament. Fritz Schuster, interior minister, and Erich Schweitzer, state commissioner, for reconstruction.

All three are members of the Democratic party, which broke with the coalition. The Democrats protested the adoption of the resolution until all technical problems involving the Saar's return to Germany were ironed out in negotiations with Bonn. The 13 Democratic deputies abstained on the vote.

Vote for Return to Bonn
 Residents of the German-speaking industrial and mining region of about 1,500 square miles voted overwhelmingly last year to return to Germany.

The Saar is to become West Germany's 10th state Jan. 1, and economic integration is to be completed by 1960.

Long a political thorn between France and Germany, the Saar was placed under the League of Nations after World War I. It was taken over by Germany in 1935 after a league-sponsored plebiscite.

Andover, Dec. 14 (Special)—The Andover Hungarian Relief Organization, formed last night by representatives of various community groups will launch a full-scale program to relocate a Hungarian family in this town.

Assisting in formation of the group was the Refugee Resettlement Committee. Besides a family, single adults and children temporarily separated from their parents will be assisted.

Mrs. George Koerber, elected chairman of the newly organized inter-denominational group, has asked assistance from community organizations and individuals to provide information concerning possible employment for refugees.

Main project of the committee will be to settle a family with children. Steps involved include location of a rental suitable for a family, and possibilities of employment.

In addition, any families able to accommodate either one or more children or a single adult are asked to contact her.

Those who are unable to assist in accommodating a refugee at this time but wish to contribute to the program may make checks payable to the Andover Hungarian Relief Fund and mail them to Mrs. Theodore Wright, Rt. 1, Andover, N.H.

Mrs. Wright represents the committee plans to place house-shaped collection boxes in town, with the hope that the same generous support which facilitated the successful relocation of a German family last year will be forthcoming for this immediate and urgent need.

Magloire Starts Exile in Jamaica

Port Au Prince, Haiti, Dec. 14 (AP)—Former President Paul Magloire today began his exile in Jamaica after being forced out of Haiti by a determined strike.

Magloire and nine members of his family reached Kingston after flight from Port au Prince in a Haitian Army plane. The ex-president declined to make any statement on his arrival in Jamaica, saying only that his plans were indefinite.

Mrs. Magloire, a professional singer, was elected president of Haiti in 1950. The Constitution prohibits two consecutive terms for a president and Magloire last May decided to try to continue in power as "chief of state." The nation rejected that election machinery by a vote of 100,000 to 10,000.

Magloire and his supporters subsequently charged the leading candidate pitched their appeal on "vicious criticism" of the government and incited the people to "terrorist violence." The strike continued until his plans to leave the country were announced.

First Negro May Don Red Hat of Cardinal

Vatican City, Dec. 14 (AP)—The first Negro to wear a cardinal's red hat may emerge from the conclave to elect the next pontiff, according to the Roman Catholic Church.

The cardinal, who is expected to be elected in the next conclave, is expected to be a Negro, according to the church's membership in Africa, known in missionary circles as "black Africa," has increased from 22 million to more than 50 million—outstripping the rate of worldwide growth. The church's membership today totals 472 millions.

Vatican circles believe that the cardinal could well include Negro Archbishop Joseph Kwana of Malawi, Uganda. He is 59 years old, relatively young for a cardinal, and has served in the highest rank for the past 10 years.

In addition to recognizing Catholicism's growth in Africa, his choice also would contain a slightly "sentimental" note. Pope Pius XII, in one of his first acts, consecrated the Negro bishop in 1953 in St. Peter's Basilica.

An increase in the number of African cardinals also would recognize the growth of the church in the United States. Membership there has increased from 22,656,242 in 1942 to 33,974,000 today.

Vatican sources say the number of U.S. cardinals is expected to increase by more than one or two unless the Pope also raises the total number of cardinals beyond the present 70. He once thought of doing this.

Among the Americans frequently mentioned as possible candidates are Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston, Francis X. McGarry of Baltimore, John Joseph Mitty of San Francisco, and more recently, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, auxiliary bishop of New York.

Italians who now hold 21 seats in the college, are expected to continue to be the largest single bloc. Their number was cut to less than a majority for the first time since the 14th century in 1846, when the Pope included only four Italians among 32 cardinals elected. This was the largest number ever named in a single conclave.

There now are 10 vacancies in the college. These places last were held by five Frenchmen and a Peruvian, a Dutchman, an Austrian, a Briton and a Frenchman.

Nasser May Use Suez As Wedge for U.S. Aid

By JAMES MARLOW (A P New Analyst)

Washington, Dec. 14 (AP)—Don't be surprised if Egyptian President Nasser uses the blockade of the Suez Canal either to try to wreck West Europe's economy or to blackmail the United States into giving economic help.

The Egyptian foreign minister, Mahmoud Fawzi, complained yesterday in Washington that he bears much in the United States about helping Britain and France, which attacked Egypt, but "hardly anything" about helping Egypt.

Mr. Fawzi said in a speech here last week that the Suez Canal, which was closed for two months to six months if work gets under way quickly.

The longer the canal is closed, the longer the economy of U.S. allies in Western Europe will be affected. This serves Russia's interests. This country also will suffer, because of the loss of revenue from ships which used the canal.

Associated Press reports from Cairo say the Egyptian economy still looks stable. It is questionable how long it will remain so without the reopening of the canal or outside assistance.

The United States and Russia are the two places where Egypt might hope to get economic help. Fawzi said Egypt wants "no assistance" from the United States or Russia. That's a switch.

Behind Canal After Loss Healed should be remembered, in watching Nasser's maneuvers in the weeks ahead, that he was engaged and seized the canal last summer within a few days after Secretary of State Dulles called off a proposed big loan to Egypt.

FBI Locates Vet Missing For 11 Years

"His income rose steadily. Since 1942 he has been a member of the select 'Million Dollar' Round Table," made up of salesmen who sell that much insurance in a year. He earns up to \$50,000 a year but is proud of the fact that, despite his lack of formal schooling, he is a faculty adviser at Purdue University's Institute of Life Insurance marketing.

Nusbaum says the public has a number of misconceptions about life insurance salesmen.

"You don't have to put your foot in a door to sell insurance," he said. "Women in particular are well-educated on the value of insurance, especially since we began emphasizing its living benefits rather than its death benefits. And you don't have to be a joiner."

Nusbaum himself belongs to only two organizations—the professional organization he heads and the American Legion.

Insurance doesn't offer as high starting salaries as some other professions, he said. "But the limitations on how far you can go in the field are those you make yourself."

The responsibility of paying idle factory workers.

The regime promised a special "loyalty bonus" and "government credits" for the building of Hungary.

When they think they can arbitrarily arrest our leaders they have another thing coming.

The Czepl complex was again forced by Soviet tanks and armed cars. The workers said Russian officers and soldiers were inside the plant and pointed at strategic points to support forces of armed Hungarian militia and police.

Some chimneys were smoking and several factory railways were in operation.

"The people who went back to work last Monday" grabbed a worker outside the gate. He referred to a Budapest Radio warning that only those would receive wages who actually worked.

"But we estimate that only 20 per cent are still working," another added. "The others won't resume until Racz and Bari are released."

Except for the work stoppage Budapest appeared quiet up to noon with streets and bus service almost back to normal.

Newsprint during the capital's industrial 11th District noted many workers standing around factory yards while others pushed handcars as slowly as possible.

Workers explained that another factor hampering production was shortage of coal and electric power. The electricity was shut off this morning in many hotels in downtown Budapest.

Athens, Dec. 14 (AP)—British Colonial secretary Alan Lennox-Boyd explained to Greek government leaders today just how British plans to give Cyprus a new constitution with limited self-rule.

He conferred with Greek Premier Constantine Karamanlis at the end of the constitutional proposals.

53 Hospitalized Following Lunch

Los Angeles, Dec. 14 (AP)—A woman collapsed in pain. Another was stricken with cramps and nausea. Then another. A breakfast luncheon yesterday at St. Malin's Roman Catholic Church in Huntington Park broke up in disorder and within a few hours 53 persons were hospitalized.

"There is little doubt that it is food poisoning," said F. X. Kemp, chief of the County Health Department's food and drug section. Kemp said it apparently was a type which develops when food is left too long out of refrigeration after being cooked.

A caterer furnished the turkey and trimmings. Nearly all those who became ill were women. There were 250 guests.

A spokesman at one hospital said some of the victims were in serious condition but Kemp said such cases rarely are fatal. His technicians began tests on food samples to determine exactly what caused the trouble.

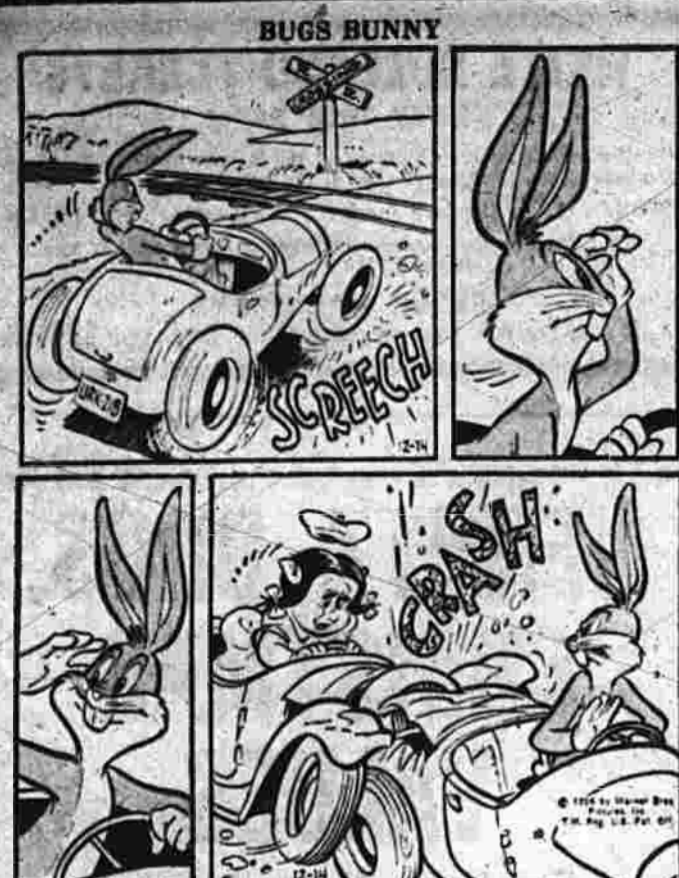

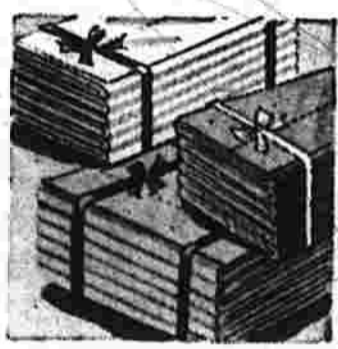
