Gov. Abraham A. Ribicoff named the committee last May 29 "to determine what the immediate and long-term policies of the state should be in the field of mental retardation."

The committee said that as the result of its surveys it can presume there are 60,000 retarded children and adults in Connecticut, but only a few are cared for in the state's two training schools.

It said that the Manafield Training school as of Nov. 1 had 1,754 patients.
