President Outlines 1957 Hopes, Plans

Washington, Dec. 28 (AP)—Sen. A. J. Aiken, Republican leader of the House, said today that President Eisenhower will outline his hopes and plans for the nation during the next year.

With the aid of Vice President Nixon, Budget Director Perlmutter and all cabinet members except Secretary of State Dulles and Secretary of Defense Wilson, Eisenhower planned to review with top legislative leaders the administration's domestic program for 1957.

That includes matters like school aid, tax, labor and farm legislation.

The big foreign affairs issues—such as the Middle East, Cuba, and the Korean Peninsula—were discussed, but were primarily reserved for later.

Fire Cuts Hartford Cathedral Second Catholic Church Severely Damaged in 32 Hours

\$5 Million Loss At St. Joseph's

Hartford, Dec. 31 (AP)—Hartford Fire Chief Henry G. Thomas said shortly after noon today that the 4 1/2 hour fire that virtually destroyed St. Joseph's Cathedral was under control.

The effort to save the historical, huge cathedral failed; said the chief, when the blaze spread up into a crawlway between the ceiling and the roof. This section of the building had no fire stops, he stated.

Hartford, Dec. 31 (AP)—St. Joseph's Cathedral, center of worship for Catholics of the Archdiocese of Hartford, was destroyed by fire today.

For an hour, the great structure was like a giant furnace raving full blast. The heat drove firemen back and could be felt a block away.

City Manager Carleton F. Sharpe estimated that the monetary damage would range upwards of \$5 million.

Fire was discovered in the church after the 7:30 mass this morning. By 11 a.m. the entire Cathedral was a raging inferno. Flames covered the roof of the massive structure. Smoke billowed a thousand feet in the air.

Firemen had fought the fire for an hour and a half in the cathedral. The four-hour blaze watching the spire high point at the rear of the building. It was over the roof—and signaling the destruction of the cathedral.

The fire was the second to strike a Catholic church in the city within 24 hours. St. Patrick's Church and Church of Ann Streets was ravaged by fire early Sunday morning.

Causes of the fire are still unknown and even while firemen were watching the spire high point at the rear of the building, it was not clear what caused the fire.

Officers abandoned the search for the cause of the fire. The volume of smoke was so dense that the fire department was unable to concentrate on the real thing. The search for the cause "Mad Bomber."

The city's 20,000-member police society planned to stand guard in particular, have been assigned in recent days checking out telephone booth threats.

The call received a high point Friday when it was received. The volume dropped to 26 on Saturday and reached a low of 12 yesterday.
