In other accident deaths, 69 persons lost their lives in fires and 106 others were killed in other types of mishaps, for an over-all total of 574. The weekend traffic toll was far below the 706 deaths on the nation's highways during the Christmas holiday period, which was a record for any holiday.

Over 1,000 for Holidays However, the combined total for the two holidays set a new high-with more than 1,100 traffic deaths. It marked the first time in history the total for the two holidays reached more than 1,000. The old record was 973, set during the 3-day celebration periods at the end of 1955 and the start of 1956. The National Safety Council, which last week had predicted 450

traffic deaths, lowered its figure during the holiday "The drivers and the traffic ennt officers deserve a big vote of thanks from everybody for teaming up to hold down the toll," Ned H. Dearborn, council presi-
