

Mad Gunmen Kill Man, Wife

Mad dog gunmen, who rob and kill brutally for small sums of money, have taken their fourth and fifth Connecticut victims—a man and his wife who were customers in a shoe store.

The latest of the killings occurred in North Haven Saturday night.

Police said the couple, Mr. and Mrs. Bernard Speyer, apparently walked in on the gunmen as they robbed the shoe store owner.

They were forced to kneel on the floor and shoot through the back of the head. The proprietor, Frank Adinolfi, 44, was pistol-whipped into unconsciousness.

Take \$50 from Register
Police said the holdup netted the bandits \$50 from the cash register, \$12 from Adinolfi's wallet and an undetermined amount of money—presumably small—found on the dead couple. Speyer was a factory worker and his wife a secretary.

The outbreak of brutal slayings—all of which seem to follow a similar pattern—started Dec. 15 in New Britain.

There, in a gas station in a lonely section of the city, two men—the proprietor and a customer—were robbed of an apparently small sum of money and killed. Both were shot through the back of the head.

On the same night in Hartford—about eight miles from New Britain—a gunman entered a lonely tailor shop, fired a bullet into the face of the tailor and fled with a small sum of money. The tailor lived, however. The bullet, police said, deflected into his shoulder.

On Dec. 26, a liquor store proprietor in East Hartford was found dead in his store in a quiet section of that town. He had been shot twice in the back of the head. His cash register was cleaned of money, but police did not know of how much. Again it was presumed to be a relatively little.

Police said the bullets used in the New Britain slayings and the East Hartford killing were not of the same caliber. They did not disclose, however, the caliber of bullets used in either of the holdups.

Nevertheless they did not rule out the possibility the killings

Single Fatality On Highway in State Snowfall

Hartford, Jan. 7 (AP)—Connecticut awoke under a one-to-four inch snow blanket this morning that slowed traffic and caused a number of highway accidents, including one fatality.

Travelers Weather Service predicted more snow for today. Just furies, the forecaster said, without any real accumulation.

The one fatal accident reported by State Police took the life of 17-year-old Bernice Arnesta of Torrington late Sunday.

The car in which she was riding, police said, collided with a vehicle operated by the Rev. John J. Zihala, pastor of the Sacred Heart Church in Torrington.

Critically Injured
On the Wilbur Cross Highway in Milford, Mrs. Theresa D'Unger, 26, Fall River, Mass., was critically injured when the car in which she was a passenger skidded and struck a tree.

Officer Frank Dowling of the State Police Traffic division said a number of lesser skidding accidents were reported, but that roads this morning were in fairly good condition.

State Highway Department trucks and many town-owned trucks spent part of the night plowing an spreading sand to clear the highways for morning traffic.

"Motorists can go anywhere, but they should drive slower," Officer Dowling advised. "There's very little ice on the roads."

East-bound traffic on the two bridges into Hartford was lined up bumper-to-bumper for almost a mile at 8:30 a.m. Normally, the bridge-crossing rush subsides before this time.

A Travelers weatherman said that while snow measured four inches in Groton, Canaan, Litchfield and Stafford Springs, the accumulation was only two inches in Danbury and Westport and but an inch in Bethany.

Chou Stopping In Moscow on Way to Poland

Moscow, Jan. 7 (AP)—Chou En-lai flew into Moscow today for a 3-day stopover en route to visits to two of the most crucial areas of the communist world—Poland and Hungary.

The announced purpose of Chou's trip to Europe was to make a promised state visit to Poland where Wladyslaw Gomulka, the new party leader, is apparently anxious to convince the Chinese Communists that he is on a proper path. Tass reported from Peiping that Chou would continue on to Budapest for a meeting with the Janos Kadar government. The Chinese Premier, last in Moscow in July of 1954, when he was en route home from the Geneva Conference, appeared fit and happy as he stepped down the steps from his plane in a light snow. Iron-clad security regulations were in effect.

The Chinese Communist leader had just returned to Peiping from a tour of India, Pakistan and Burma before leaving for Moscow. Top leaders of the Soviet government and party were on hand to welcome Chou and his party at Nikovo Airfield, outside Moscow. His fast-moving Soviet jet plane could not land at Central Airfield within the capital where dignitaries are usually welcomed.

Soviet President Klementi Voroshilov, Premier Nikolai Bulganin and party boss Nikita Khrushchev were waiting to grasp Chou's outstretched hand as he emerged from the plane.

Also on hand were Deputy Premiers V. M. Molotov, Anastas Mikoyan, Lazar Kaganovich and Foreign Minister Dmitri Shepilov. In a speech at the southern Siberian city of Irkutsk en route, Chou described the unity of Communist China and Russia as "the main guarantee of universal peace."

In an airport speech here, Chou

Kadar's 'New Look' Get-tough Stalinism

Budapest, Hungary, Jan. 7 (AP)—Premier Janos Kadar's Soviet-installed government, taking the wraps off its long-promised "new program," combines get-tough Stalinism with an appeal to the West for financial aid.

The program was issued yesterday from the Premier's office in Parliament Building, ringed by protesting Russian tanks. It was broadcast as a 10,000 word statement over the Budapest Radio.

The statement probably got its final drafting last week while visiting Soviet Communist party chief Nikita Khrushchev looked on. The Hungarians, led by some in-formants to expect a "surprisingly mild" declaration, were told among other things:

"These are a dictatorship of the proletariat in Hungary... The counter-revolutionaries and persons who attack the legal order and the basic principles of the People's Democracy have no freedom even if they mask their counter-revolutionary efforts by democratic slogans. The law will always punish them severely..."

In an obvious reference to the Soviet-crushed revolt in November, the statement said:

"People of petty bourgeois thinking or people who were masking themselves as Marxists set as their aim the disintegration of social order and the dissolution of it whereby they used slogans like democracy, de-Stalinization, and others... it is therefore a main task to strengthen the People's Democratic installations and organizations..."

The statement said "The government is planning talks with various public figures and nonpartisan experts aimed at their participation in leading state affairs with the government." This indicated some sort of coalition government but did not mention any non-Communist parties.

The government pledged a continuation of the socialization of agriculture and asserted that

Senators Map Push To Curb Filibusters

Washington, Jan. 7 (AP)—Sen. Douglas (D-Ill.) said today he and other Senators are interested in "meaningful" Civil Rights legislation will launch by nightfall a new move to curb filibusters.

Douglas said the group would introduce a resolution which would allow a majority of the Senate's elected members to impose a time limit on debate, and thus kill off a filibuster, on any matter which has been under discussion for 15 calendar days. Sundays and holidays would not be counted.

He said the resolution would allow the debate limit, known as "cloture," to be imposed by a third of the Senators present and voting at any time during those first 15 days.

Under the controversial Rule 22, debate cannot be limited now without the votes of at least 64 Senators, or two-thirds of the body's entire membership.

Sen. Knowland of California, the Senate Republican leader, had announced Friday he also would move today to propose a new Rule 22. Knowland said his resolution would allow the imposition of cloture by two-thirds of the Senators voting on such a motion.

Sen. Douglas said he believes the rule change he will recommend is "a necessary first step before we can hope for the passage of meaningful Civil Rights legislation."

Encino, Calif., Jan. 7 (AP)—Marie McDonald, "The Body" of filmland fame, says two swarthy men kidnaped her and set \$80,000 as the price they would ask for her return.

The glamorous blonde actress, wearing a white nightgown, burst into tears twice as she told a news conference in her bedroom yesterday that the men said they hoped to ransom her for \$20,000 each from these four persons:

Actor Michael Wilding, estranged husband of actress Elizabeth Taylor, and Miss McDonald's escort in recent weeks.

Shoe manufacturer Harry Karl, twice married and twice divorced from Miss McDonald.

Mrs. Marie Tuboni, her mother.

Harold Plant, Miss McDonald's business manager.

The two men called Karl and her mother, she said, and dialed the telephone so she could talk to Wilding and Plant. Ransom wasn't mentioned in any of the calls.

"They wanted to build up worry with each call so that they would pay the ransom," Miss McDonald, flanked by two attorneys, told newsmen in the same bedroom from which she said she was abducted.

After she disappeared Thursday night male callers phoned Karl and Mrs. Tuboni and Miss McDonald phoned Wilding, Plant and movie columnist Harrison Carroll.

Kennedy, appearing yesterday on WCBA-TV's "Citizens Union Spotlight," did not explain the nature of the "leads" but said they are being checked.

In any case, said the commissioner, he felt his department had sufficient information on hand to definitely identify the "Bomber" if he is captured. He declined to elaborate.

Sees Move Boosting Tension with Soviet

Washington, Jan. 7 (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles said today the United States would not invade any Middle East country to overthrow an already-installed government—no matter how that government got there.

A U.S. guarantee against overt red aggression plus economic aid, Dulles told Congress, is how President Eisenhower's Middle East manifesto counts on meeting the threat of Communist subversion.

Washington, Jan. 7 (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles testified today President Eisenhower's Middle East manifesto would increase tensions with Russia but would "stop World War III before it starts."

Dulles appeared before a jam-packed hearing of the House Foreign Affairs committee. He spoke from a prepared statement and then submitted to questions from committee members.

The Secretary appealed for congressional approval of "a rounded program of economic and military assistance" including a advance authority for the President to use U.S. military forces against any "overt armed aggression" spawned by communism in the Middle East.

He was the first of a parade of administration witnesses called to detail the proposal which President Eisenhower presented at a special joint session of Congress Saturday.

"Area of Turbulence"
In an exchange with Chairman Gordon (D-Ill.) Dulles said the Soviet Union is seeking to make "an area of turbulence" out of the Middle East, and he added:

"I think, Mr. Chairman, we must recognize that this action may temporarily at least increase tensions with the Soviet Union."

But he said the purpose of the President's proposal is "to stop World War III before it starts."

Referring to the proposal's fight-if-we-must provision, Dulles said he has no doubt what Congress would do "international communism set out on a piecemeal conquest of the world by war."

"But until the Congress has actually spoken," he said, "there is doubt in the Middle East and there may be doubt in the Soviet Union."

In the Senate, Republican leader Knowland of California said that despite sharp criticism of the President's proposal he is confident Congress will approve "a statement of policy making it clear the country will not permit Soviet aggression in the Middle East."

"The details of this proposal are going to be subjected to scrutiny and possible revision," Knowland told reporters. "But I do not think
