

Washington, Jan. 9 (P)—Asst. Secretary of Defense C: C. Furnas said today military researchers want to solve such problems as extending the range of radar and finding better ways to detect sub-

Furnas, assistant secretary in charge of research and develop-ment, outlined some of the problems confronting military and civilian scientists in notes prepared for an address to the National Security Industrial Assn. The Association was organized in 1944 to serve as a link between industry and the armed forces.

He said Defense Department expenditures for research now represent more than one-third of the search and added that indications are this level would continue or even increase somewhat. Basic problems of physical scince are also problems of the mili-

tary, he said citing as an example the need for metals to withstand great heat and plastics that will retain their properties at temperatures of several hundred degrees. In his prepared notes, Furnes "New and better methods of target detection are badly needed, new fundamental knowledge is sought which could lead to longer range radar detection. "New discoveries in methods of

underwater target detection (submarines) are much in demand. We ing and distinguishing ground Furnas declared that the whole research and development program - "and hence our national safety" - depends on having an adequate number of good scientists and engineers — now in short supply.
