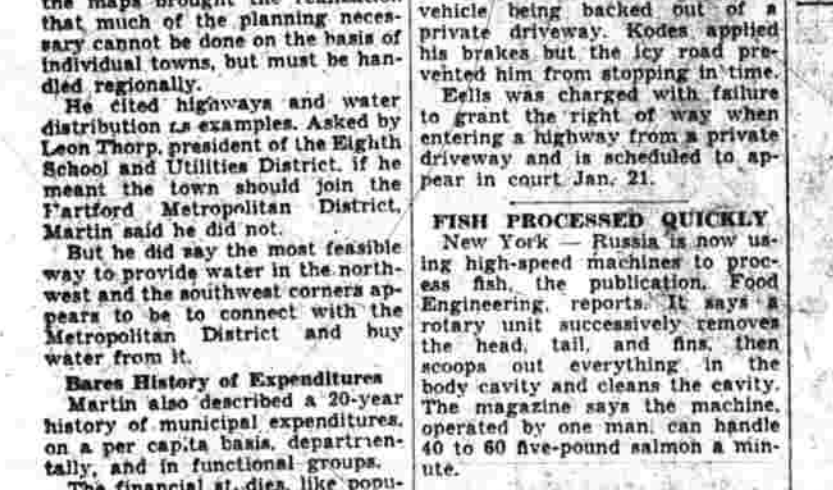

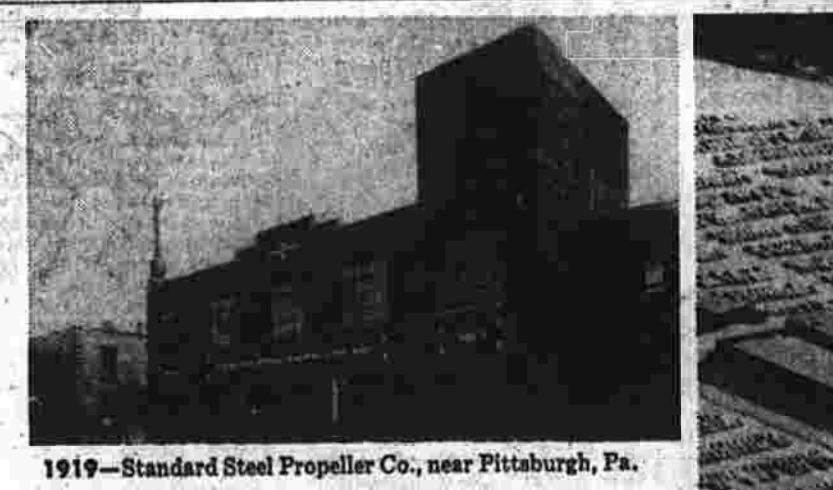

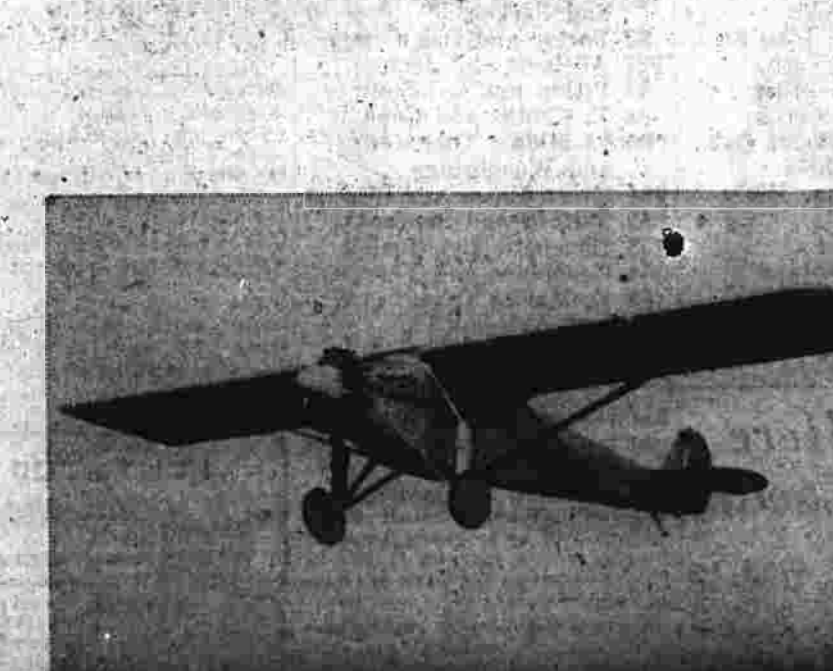

In the Eisenhower program it was quite conceivable that events might get out of hand that would lead to fighting.

No Help from Europe Sen. Kefauver (D-Tenn.) said there had been no administration effort to get Great Britain, France and other nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization to join in the undertaking involved in the plan.

The president was a part of the plan, Dulles said. "It would be absurdly doomed from the beginning. It would not succeed."

Dulles added that at the present time "feeling is running high in that area," presumably referring to the British and American situation.

Kefauver said the administration proposed to embark unilaterally on a program that is "incompatible with the benefit of western Europe."
