Requests for atomic energy research and development, stockpiling of strategic goods, home Civil Defense and the U.S. Information Agency are included in the plan. Eisenhower's program is an effort to increase the country's economic activity and to provide a surplus of \$1,000,000,000 by the end of the fiscal year. The plan also calls for a 10 per cent increase in the national debt.

The President said he sees a second straight advance in the current fiscal year ending next June 30. Reversing production of steel, August, he said, he now believes government revenue will outstrip spending by \$1,000,000,000 this year.

Hal Boyle Down Memory Lane With King of Jazz

New York (AP)—All the kings of what Westbrook Porter so aptly called "the era of Wonderful Non-sense" are dead, dignified, or retired—except one.

At the age of 61, Paul Whitman, the original "King of Jazz," looks 20 years younger, still bolly ever with the impetuous energy that made the 1920's one of history's most memorable decades.

Paul, who for a time at the old Hippodrome conducted his band along a white horse (can Arturo Toscanini match this claim?), has put together a golden anniversary record album to celebrate his 50 years in music.

The album has taken many an aging jazz lover back to the excitement of his life with Duke Ellington, who died young, blew a trumpet as no man has since, and a young unknown called Bing Crosby was one of those "Baby Face" boys and didn't have a racehorse to his name.

The rest of this piece is a monologue of memories and memories by "Baby Face" Whitman who keeps the 1920's wrapped in his soul but remains as fresh as tomorrow's as fresh as the jazz when it started. They called it ragtime.

It began on a hot night in the Denzels Symphony Orchestra in 1906 when I was 18. By 1919 I had my own orchestra and came East.

"I had nine pieces and I built the band up to 46, containing the string section.

Those were the years! In 1925 I grossed \$680,000—before taxes, thank the Lord!

Hartford, Jan. 16 (AP)—The Connecticut Public Expenditure Council (CPEC) today announced that the total tax bill for the new federal budget will cost Connecticut taxpayers \$1,501,848,000. According to Carter W. Atkins, executive director of the organization, "This is the equivalent of about \$623 for every man, woman and child in the state."

The new budget presented to Congress today estimates the federal government will spend \$71.8 billion in the new fiscal year. New budget receipts are estimated at \$78.8 billion, so that there will be a surplus of \$7 billion.

"The federal government should and must take steps to ease the tax burden," Atkins declared. "The new budget is a balanced budget in fiscal 1968. This new budget is balanced on an extremely high level of spending and taxation."

Dag Says Israelis Must Leave Gaza

United Nations, N.Y., Jan. 16 (AP)—Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld declared today the withdrawal of Israeli forces behind the 1948 armistice line is an essential step for restoring peace with Egypt.

In a progress report to the 80-nation General Assembly, Hammarskjöld said he had held extensive but unsuccessful discussions with representatives of Israel.
