What is missing in this situation is a certain quality of peace. Nehru's quality he usually brings to other world problems. It is a quality of reason, of understanding, of automatic equipment. The way they change position in formations and override each other when they are in motion is directed.

This is a pleasing mystery of authority, impressive though it is, and that he has never presumed himself to realize it, may however, convince him that his own mind stretches him in the field of the world. It is a fact, the problem of Kashmir is perhaps the one world problem of our time for which Nehru has not had, sooner or later, some compromise proposal.

Nehru has been a great backer of the United Nations and his decisions to intervene in Korea and the Near East.

The long-standing decision of the United Nations on the question of Kashmir is that a free plebiscite of the people of Kashmir should determine whether Kashmir is to go to India or to Pakistan.

This plebiscite has been suspended to be conducted by the United Nations. India and Pakistan had withdrawn the troops with which they have partitioned the country. But apparently neither country has been willing to withdraw its troops. Now the larger part of the country, occupied by Indian troops, has been going through certain plebiscite motions, including the holding of a constitutional assembly, which has taken a vote on whether it would join India on Jan. 26.

It is in anticipation of this date that the United Nations is demanding that the United Nations should be asked to halt all plebiscite motions to be all legal and un-biased. The United Nations Security Council is expected to reaffirm its own previous decision for a plebiscite. Meanwhile, Nehru apparently will have Kashmir, and India will have the United Nations as a voter.

This situation could be a cause of a war, which Nehru, apparently, regards as somewhat less likely, than war in Korea or war in the Near East or war in China or war in Hungary. That is the way human beings are, sometimes with perhaps at least one blind spot reserved and guaranteed for even the best of us.

Washington, Jan. 21 (AP)—President Eisenhower pledged today his second term will be dedicated to "the building of a peace with justice" to thwart "international communism and the power of its control."

In his inaugural address, Eisenhower painted a picture of a prosperous, strong America. "But he added this is not the whole of our world."

"In too much of the Earth there is want, discord, danger," Eisenhower said. "New forces and new nations stir and strive against the earth, with power to bring, by their fate, great good or great evil to the free world's future."

"The entire world is divided and the divisive force is international communism and the power that it controls," Eisenhower went on.

"The desire of that power, dark in purpose, are clear in practice. It strives to nullify the freedom of men who love freedom, especially the needs of the hungry and the hopes of the oppressed."
