Rockville-Vernon High School Water Supply Brings Out New Difficulties

Rockville, Jan. 24 (Special)—Work on the mechanical engineering design of the new high school is at a standstill awaiting assurance of a water supply to the site on Lovelock Hill according to a statement today by John G. Talcott Jr., chairman of the high school building committee.

The Rockville Water and Aqueduct Co. proposes to run a new main through Regan St. since the volume of water now piped to the west end of the city is inadequate for the needs of the school.

The water company requested from the city council the proper layout of the street and correct grade so that the main would be laid at the proper depth should the street be improved at some future time.

Regan St., however, does not meet city standards in that it is too narrow at the intersection of Bellevue Ave. The city council, therefore, asked Corp. Counsel Harry Hammer to look into and report on the easement and rights of way involved.

Mr. Hammer said today he had talked with Francis S. Rupprecht, general manager of the water company, and will expedite investigation of the situation. He said it appeared likely arrangements could be made for the main to run through Regan St. Talcott, expressed concern over the two-month delay since the building committee's request for extension of a water main to the high school site.

He said the delay in the project affects greatly the mechanical engineering design of the school. As an example, he noted the size of the water pressure which would vary from a water main or a driven well. Secondly, he said, the type of water furnished may require a water softener which would require an architectural change involving the utilization of a well which could cause a complete change in the location of the school.

The high school building committee hesitates to recommend drilling one or more wells when such a sizable quantity of water is required and the cost undetermined. Also, the committee feels a water main will undoubtedly be extended to the school site.

Hammer also noted that fire hydrants on a recognized water supply provide the best fire protection for a school as well as reducing the cost of insurance.
