## Would Pool Unused **Quotas for Refugees**

Washington, Jan 31 (P)-President Eisenhower today asked changes in the immigration laws so it will be easier to give haven to refugees "who have fled or in the future flee" from Communist tyranny.

In a 2,000-word special message to Congress, the President called also for general revisions of the law to allow about 65,000 more immigrants to come to this country each year. The present annual quota is 154,857 and is based on the 1920 census. Eisenhower asked quotas based on the 1950 population census.

Eisenhower also called for a redistribution of the immigration quota "in proportion to the actual immigration" from 1924 through July 1, 1955.
