Training Center for Reserves Planned in Town by Army

Plans to build a United States Army Reserve (USAR) Training Center in Manchester have been announced by Col. Duncan S. Somerville, chief of the U.S. Army Military District of Connecticut.

Col. Arthur V. Williams, district executive officer said today it will be a year or 18 months before the training center, essentially a school building, is completed.

A site selection committee of local residents is now working with town officials on selection of a location. Col. L. W. Ruddy of 26 Deepwood Dr. heads the local group.

Several Sites Inspected Park Superintendent Joseph A. Williams said today that the site selection committee will be a single building to accommodate 100 men. It will contain offices, classrooms, locker, snack and assembly hall. The structure will be brick, and it must be located on a plot of from 35 to 5 acres.

According to Gen. Somerville, the center is being built to make available to young men in the Manchester area, places where they may meet once a week to receive instruction in military subjects. There are five USAR units in town now.

Will Not Violate Law Gen. Somerville said town zoning law and building codes will not be violated. Bidding will be open to local contractors.

The first site selection will be made by Department of the Army representatives. Col. Williams said the first impact of a military law, which permits enlistees and draftees to serve in the Army for six months and fill

the rest of their term of service in the active reserve, will be felt this month. The Department of the Army is building training centers to meet the expected demand.
