Senators Welcome Grand Jury Probe Of Oil Price Boost

Washington, Feb. 9 (AP)—Senators O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) and Magnuson (D-Wash.) said today they welcome a grand jury investigation of recent increases in oil and gasoline prices.

"I am very glad the Justice Department is taking up the story," said O'Mahoney. "The investigation has not been satisfactory and it is our hope that a grand jury will be appointed to investigate the matter."

O'Mahoney is chairman of the Senate Anti-Monopoly Public Lands subcommittee which has been looking into the operations of the oil-firm program, inaugurated after Federal District Judge Albert V. Bryan in Detroit issued an order for the firm to conduct a separate study of gas-oil price increases.

Yesterday in March, Alexander, Va., attorneys from the Justice Department's Anti-Trust Division advised Federal District Judge Albert V. Bryan to conduct a grand jury investigation of the companies and individuals engaged in the production, refining and sale of oil.

Judge Bryan authorized the inquiry and directed that a grand jury be convened March 4. Justice Department officials said it is expected to take up the matter in Alexandria, just across the Potomac.

Initial Atomic Electric Power Plant in Tests Chicago, Feb. 9 (AP)—A big stride will be taken today into the field of atomic generated electric power.

The nation's first nuclear power system designed solely for experiments in producing such power will go into continuous operation. The schedule calls for a year-long trial run with refueling.
