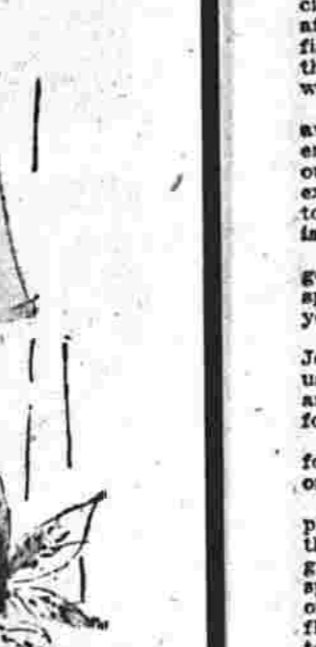

### TV Plan to Show First-Run Films

Bartlesville, Okla., Feb. 13 (AP)—Phil Hayes said today he expects by May 1 to be playing first-run movies into home television sets in Bartlesville for 10 to 15 months. Hayes first announced his plans last September for a project which is believed to be the first in the country.

He said today he is negotiating with Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. and the Public Service Co. of Oklahoma for transmission lines and equipment. He also announced plans for a headquarters building. Hayes plans to use regular 35-millimeter theater film to transmit movies throughout Bartlesville. A lead wire from the main coaxial cable will be attached to the switch for an unused channel on a subscriber's TV set.

He expects to run the system from noon to midnight daily, using three different movies a week. They may or may not be the same movies he offers at the Bartlesville theater he manages.

There will be no commercial advertising. Hayes said color movies can be shown with some modification of the equipment he will use at the Bartlesville plant.

He is a veteran theater operator, although only 22.

"Motion picture theaters will continue to operate as in the past and nothing will happen to them as the result of this project," he says.

### Photo in Paper, Fugitive Found

Washington, Feb. 13 (AP)—Robert L. Green, player on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's "10 most wanted" list only two days ago, was captured early today in St. Paul, Minn.

The FBI said Green, a 27-year-old escapee from Utah State Prison in 1954, had been identified in a photograph of Green published in a Minneapolis newspaper. He had been seen in the newspaper account and was en route to Milwaukee to avoid arrest.

J. Edgar Hoover, director of the FBI, said Green had lived in California, was married, and resided at several Minneapolis addresses under the name of Floyd Samuel Baker since his escape from prison 2 1/2 years ago. He had been in a plumbing supply house.

Describing the prison break, the announcement said: "With reckless abandon, amid a hail of gunfire from a prison guard... Green and a fellow convict scaled a fence of the Utah State Prison, dived into an irrigation ditch and fled."

Green had been serving a 3 to 20-year sentence for burglary and a 5-year to life sentence for a brutal armed robbery. He had been sought by the FBI since Oct. 5, 1954, on a charge of unlawful flight to avoid confinement.

(Born in Idaho, Green has an arrest record as a juvenile in California, received a dishonorable discharge from the armed forces and had been paroled in 1952 from the Utah State Prison. He will be arraigned before a United States commissioner in St. Paul today.)

### Cypriot Escapes Death Sentence

Nicosia, Cyprus, Feb. 12 (AP)—For the first time, Gov. Sir John Harding has commuted to life imprisonment the death sentence of a Greek Cypriot condemned for an EOKA assassination.

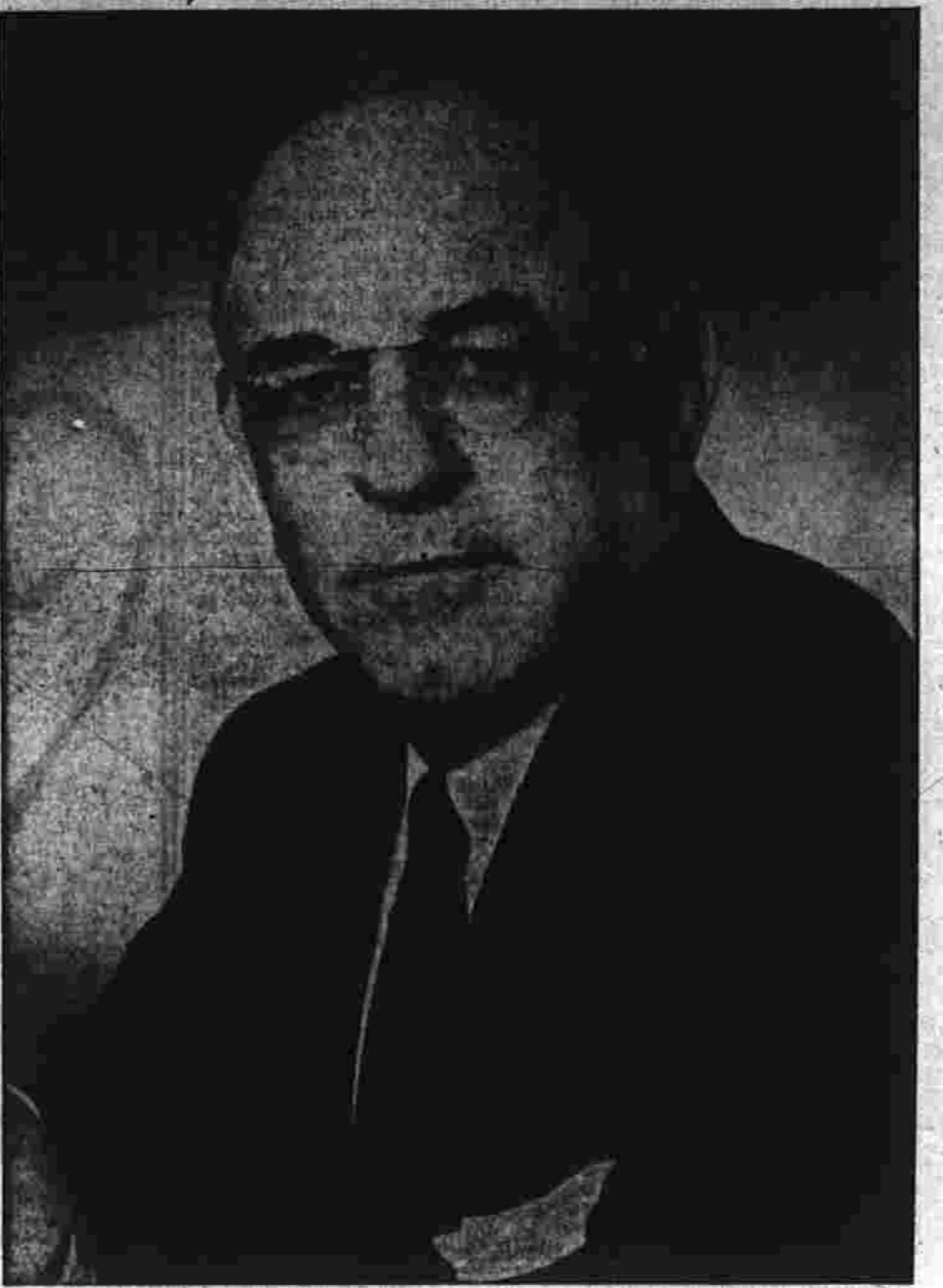

Cause Threat of War

It declared the Soviet Union had a duty to draw attention to the aggressive action of the United States caused by the fact that of late the United States has taken new steps which aggravate relations between states and cause a threat of war.

The letter added that U.S. policy "more and more reflects aggressive tendencies which worsen the international situation at a time when the majority of the states are trying to liquidate the Cold War."

The Russians on Jan. 23 warned against establishment of U.S. nuclear weapon and missile bases in other countries. Such installations were called "hedgehogs for preparation for atomic warfare."

The Soviet news agency Tass and the Soviet Communist party newspaper Pravda declared countries permitting such bases would be the first to suffer quick retaliation in the event of war.

Their warning singled out Britain, France, West Germany, Italy, Turkey, Iran and Japan.

The U.S. State Department termed that Soviet warning an attempt at "propaganda intimidation."

Feb. 6, the Soviet Foreign Ministry staged an elaborate televised news conference in Moscow to charge the United States is carrying on an unprecedented espionage campaign that amounts to secret war against the Soviet Union and other Communist countries.

### USW Gives Rarick Surprising Support

(Continued from Page One)

tract negotiations, pledged to fight for further gains and said the dues increase was needed to finance union activities.

The first returns, from 54 of the approximately 2,700 union locals showed, McDonald with 12,167 votes to 9,896 for Rarick.

Most of these locals are in the area around Pittsburgh, where Rarick and his supporters have been most active. Rarick carried substantial margins. Reports from seven locals at Johnston, Pa., gave Rarick 2,308 to McDonald's 879.

At Steelton, Pa., near Harrisburg in central Pennsylvania, a big local at the Bethlehem Steel Co. plant reported 1,637 votes for Rarick, 751 for McDonald. This local, No. 1688, recently had been placed under an administrator by the union leadership following a sectional dispute.

Earlier from Pittsburgh, it was a different situation.

At Buffalo, N. Y., first returns from seven locals gave McDonald 883 to Rarick.

In the Chicago area, votes tabulated from 13 small locals of Sub-district 2, District 31, put McDonald far in front, 4,500 to Rarick's 700.

Local 1289 at Detroit reported 3,022 for McDonald, 853 for Rarick.

The big surprise lay in the show of strength by Rarick in this first, contested election in the union's 20-year history. McDonald, one of the early leaders in the USW, succeeded the late Philip Murray, first president of the union, in 1952 and had been elected without opposition to a 4-year term in 1953.

Most union leaders had agreed in advance McDonald would be elected almost without a contest. In an interview election day Rarick took indirect cognizance of this, saying that he and the other "dual protest" leaders intend to remain active in union affairs regardless of the election result.

Neither Rarick nor McDonald had any comment this morning on the election situation.

The official vote may not be known for several weeks. USW members voted all day yesterday at polling places set up in their locals, and these votes are to be reported to international headquarters within 10 days. The international has until May 1 to report formally to the voters. Rarick headed a slate opposing McDonald; I. W. Abel, the international secretary-treasurer, and two district directors, Vice President Howard Hague was unopposed.

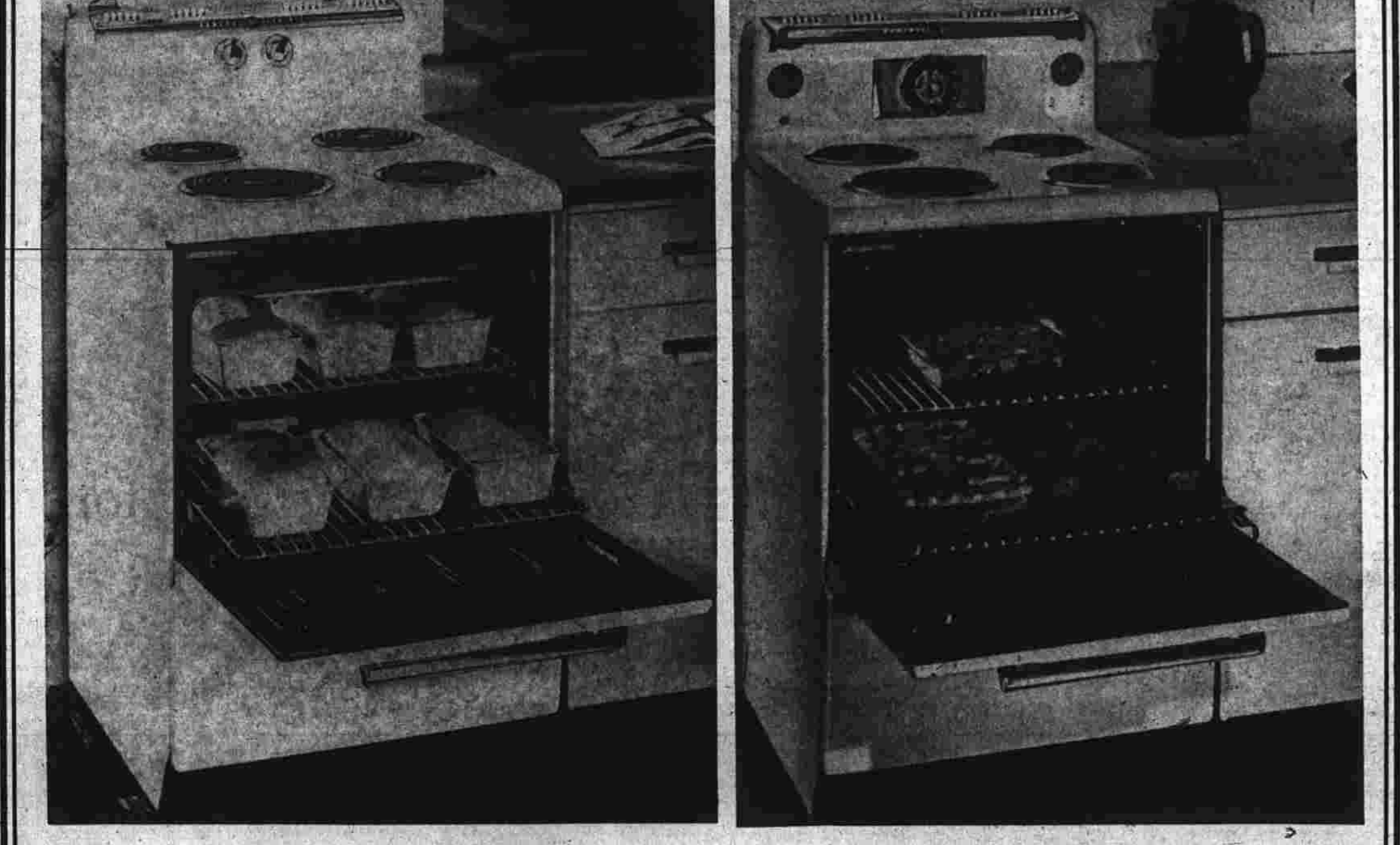
