Many Dissatisfied With Revaluation

Some 100 taxpayers appeared at a meeting last night and voiced complaints about the way the revaluation of town has affected them.

Chief target of the objections was the valuation of the houses. Taxpayers franky questioned the competence of that group.

One man asked how a field worker could evaluate a 12-room house by seeing the kitchen and basement with the result that the property assessment was valued \$1,000 higher.

Another asserted he had the best expensive home in his immediate neighborhood assessed at \$12,000 while a house of a much better value was assessed for as much as \$1,000.

The man, Richard Carocant of Grandview St., said, "It's absurd. It's absurd the reason was a mistake on the part of the revaluation firm."

Cites Example

One taxpayer asked Joseph Hanson of Revaluation Associates what should be the difference between the two Cape Cod houses which have the same in every respect except that one has the two rooms upstairs finished.

Hanson replied that the houses are the same size, are in the same immediate neighborhood, the same immediate rooming space should be about 8 per cent higher.

The taxpayer said he was saying his house was the one without finished rooms and has the higher assessment.

"How could you appraise a house you didn't see?" he asked.

Hanson replied that in such cases information from the assessors' cards was made available.

"And information from the neighborhood?" he asked.

Hanson said that where such information was available it was used.

Would Sell on New Value

Similar complaints and observations by taxpayers were voiced. A few said they would be willing to sell their property for the assessed value.

The assessed value of each property is supposed to be about 72 per cent of the fair market value.

A number of complaints were voiced about hikes in the assessment multiple by five.

Hanson said that with the end of the revaluation, multiple increases have increased in market value because people are willing to pay more for investment houses.

One man showed a reporter his assessment for a family house which had increased from about \$8,000 to about \$13,000.

He said he paid about \$13,000 for the old home 10 years ago.

Hanson said that the sale value has doubled since 10 years ago. Meanwhile, the value of the house has been depreciating physically.

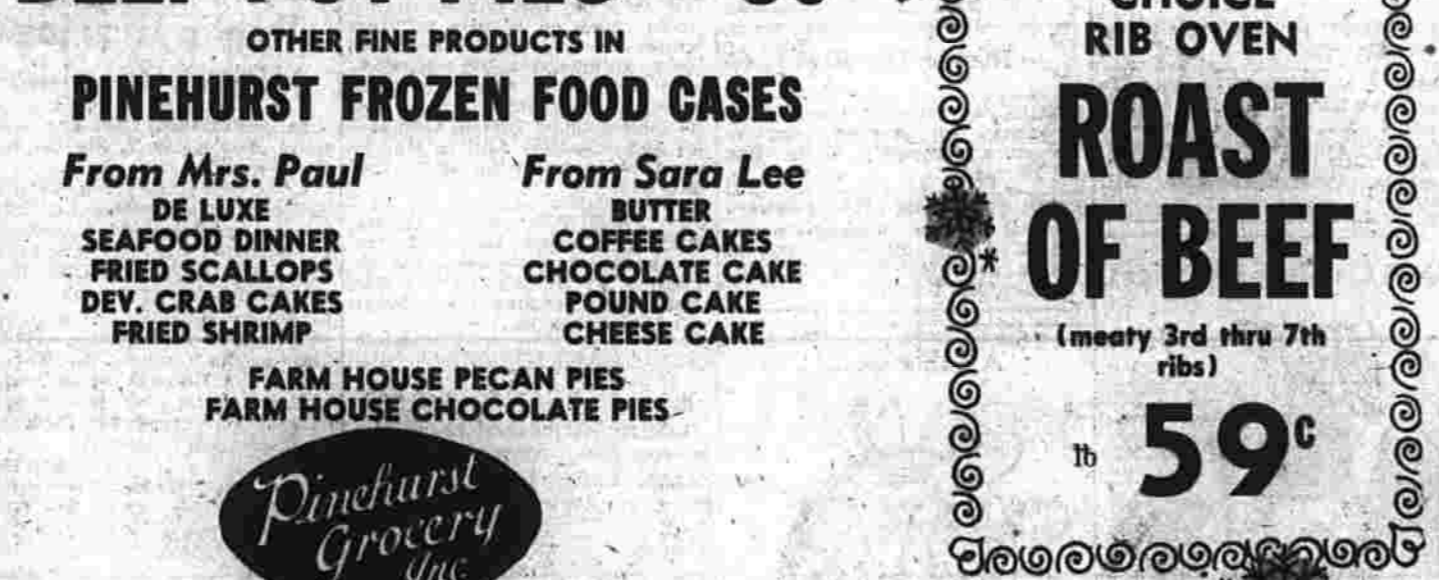
