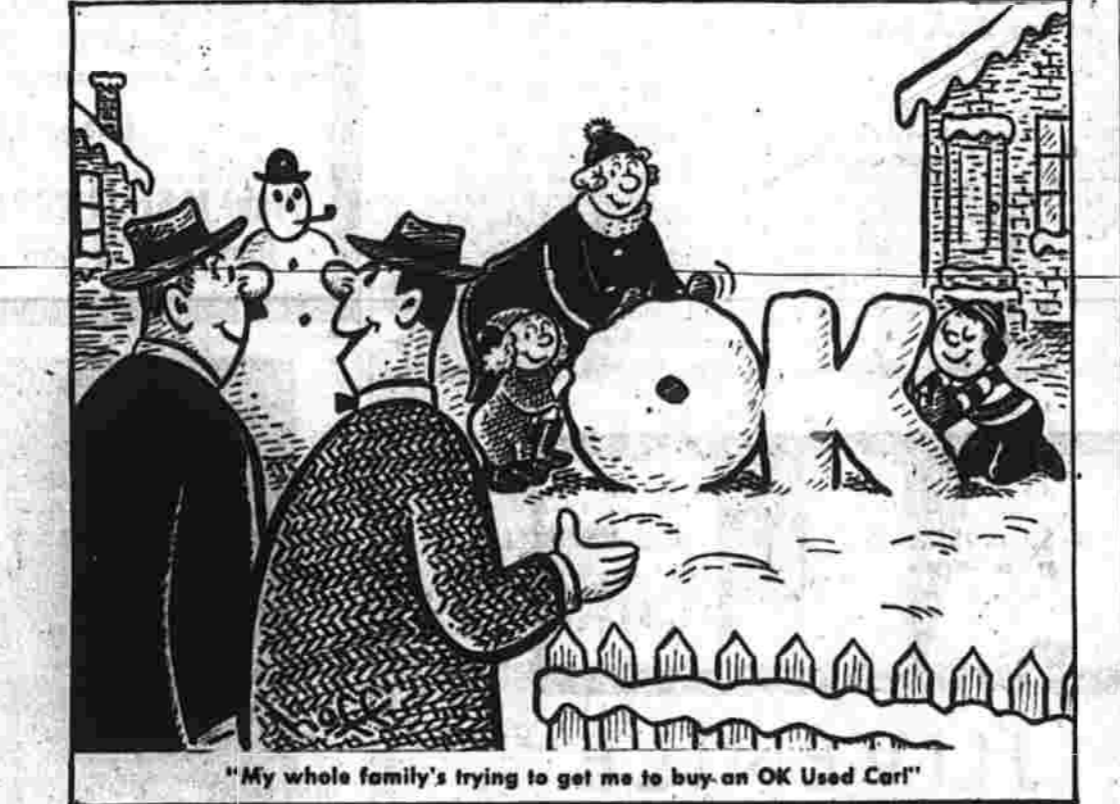

### The Junking Of NATO

For seven years now, Western policy makers have been based on the contention that only a wall of troops can give us a sense of security. NATO was organized with a scheme of military force. For seven years, NATO's main claim has been that it has been able to do only the creation of a new West German army of 800,000 men would make the situation safe.

But in the past two years, France has transferred some 300,000 of its troops, pledged to the safety of Europe, to North Africa in an effort to maintain order there. Now Britain announces that it is withdrawing 30,000 of the 80,000 troops it has stationed in Germany.

Both France and Britain had urgent reasons. France is fighting revolution in North Africa. Britain has its own problems in the Middle East.

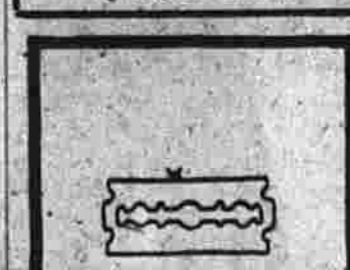
But one point, we think, is clear. The NATO concept of a wall of troops is a possibility of Russian attack in Europe as much as Western policy has formally pretended to fear it. They did really fear such an attack, they would act as if the emergency were in Europe, not in North Africa or in the British Isles.

If there were a real danger of Russian attack in Western Europe, France and Britain would not have increased their defense expenditures. Their policies deny, too, that the creation of a new West German army is an urgent thing. It has been proclaimed to be.

So, what is this run out on the part of NATO? It is a sabotage whatever good or value there may have been in the NATO concept. The United States and West Germany remain bound to the great price that had to be paid for the NATO concept—the continued existence of Germany.

There were some who thought that possibly NATO would, one day, have a certain guarantee of security. It is a guarantee that can be swapped in for German reunification. But French and British policies have, in effect, sent it to the international junkyard where it could be turned in on anything better. We seem to have a decision to reverse the costs of NATO, and none of its potential values.
