

The Polish-born musician—celebrated first, at 5, as a piano prodigy—died Saturdsy at 81 in a Los Angeles nursing home. Physicians blamed a heart attack for his death. He had been hospitalized only four days.

Hofmann's genius included such achievements as:

A finished concert pianist; a composer; a teacher of gifted pupils; a director of great conservatory; and, amazingly, as an inventor of mechanical devices and nuro accessories, for which he held more than 60 patents.
