Soviet Youth Must Labor For Learning

 The Kremlin, in a drive to rein control over restless Soviet youth, has promulgated a scheme to send students in a stratagem of labor before and after their university course.

\$28,500 Set
In Outlay for
Government

Rockville, Feb. 20 (Special)—Less than 40 townsmen last night voted the most dramatic step ever taken toward elimination of Vermont's triple government. Voters at the Town Meeting approved \$28,500 in appropriations, \$10,000 of which will provide a professional study of the town, city and fire district governments.

Other appropriations approved were: \$10,000 for Civil Defense; \$4,500 for more removal; and \$4,000 for a probate vault.

The appropriation for a probate vault was the only item on the agenda to draw opposition. Mayor Norman C. Olson said the appropriation be delayed because the city is considering other quarters for its offices, and because he felt the downtown buildings should be devoted to business.

The vault is to be installed in the office of the probate court in the Henry Building. Removal of the city offices from the town side of the downtown buildings would leave adequate space for the town needs, he said.

The probate court is being removed to provide additional space for the Selectmen's office.

"Double Standard" Argument

It is our hope, as it must be the hope of every citizen, that the hopes of the Near East problem, rather than an intensification of the deadlock there, that the United Nations will ever reach to the moment when it is faced with a vote to impose sanctions on Israel.

And we do not believe that moment will come. If it should come, however, we do not see what the United States could do but vote for the sanction.

Furthermore, we think it is possible to argue that, in such a case, neither the United Nations nor the United States would be following what Senator Knowland and other members of Congress call a "double standard of morality."

Senator Knowland's simple, straightforward analysis is that he easily separates four nations he finds have defied United Nations votes or principles. If there are to be sanctions against one of these nations, he would have to call a "double standard of morality."

The other three nations which in his book, are equally guilty with Israel are Egypt, for ignoring a United Nations demand that the Suez Canal be opened to Israel, India, for ignoring a United Nations vote that the Kashmir problem should be settled by plebiscite, and Hungary, for ignoring a United Nations resolution.

Senator Knowland would have all punished, or none.

Yet it is quite obvious that, in the minds of the members of the United Nations, the four situations are appraised differently, and would get different votes, and that these differences are not merely the result of different alignments. There are differences, sometimes wide, sometimes merely subtle, in the four situations involved.

Egypt, in denying use of the Suez Canal to Israel, was acting wrongly, but acting on Egyptian territory, and although its action had a military character, being, in fact, labeled by Egypt an exercise of Egypt's rights as a belligerent, it did not constitute a use of military force across anybody's border.

India, moving troops into Kashmir, moved into a disputed territory, not across the boundary of another nation, and its defiance of the United Nations lay in its refusal to have a plebiscite held to settle the future of a territory of the United Nations itself could not label as belonging to anyone.

Russia and Russian military forces were already inside Hungary when the Hungarian revolution began, under the same kind of arrangement, although with different intent, by which American forces are in Germany, Japan and Okinawa. The final action of these Russian forces, reinforced by other coming across the border, was a brutal onslaught on the cause of Hungarian freedom.

The intent and result of their action, however, was a preservation of the status quo which, however hateful it may have been, had legal standing. The reality was that they were murdering Hungarians who fought for Hungarian freedom. But they were doing so from a position the United Nations had previously tolerated and had not condemned until it was really have condemned unless it had been prepared to drive all occupying forces from all countries everywhere. How would we act if there were revolution in West Germany, or in Japan, or in Okinawa? Now has Britain reacted to revolution in Cyprus, or France to revolution in North Africa?

Against these three instances, Israel, under protest, has issued a full scale military attack.

Of Authors and Doctrines

Harry Truman was found himself unable to visit Greece and Turkey on the anniversary of the Truman Doctrine, because, he has told the State Department, he is all dated up. However, the inevitable, Washington gossip gives other reasons for his decision not to go. The gossip says Harry was disappointed over the cold, formal nature of the duties letter suggesting that he might go, and over the failure of the Eisenhower administration to volunteer to provide him with some special official designation or title to wear on his visit.

That means that Greece and Turkey will have to content themselves with the Truman Doctrine without the presence of the man whose name it bears.

The thought occurs, however, that we might be able to send them somebody else, as a sort of second best. How would it be, for instance, to send them the man who really originated the Truman Doctrine, or, as a third choice, the whole group of men who reportedly spent one whole Sunday back in 1947 convincing Mr. Truman that he had to do it?

First, of course, we would have to find out ourselves. The mystery of the authorship of the Truman Doctrine has been well preserved for 10 years. The Truman administration give no clear clue, their inference being, in fact, that maybe Truman himself drafted it.

Our guess is that Truman had more to do with the Truman Doctrine than President Eisenhower. He had to do with the thing now being called the Eisenhower Doctrine.

All this, however, seems to be in rather good form, so far as doctrines are concerned. The Truman Doctrine, for instance, seems to really be the doctrine of John Quincy Adams doctrine, and should have made Adams famous if anybody. Back in our own time, the Marshall Plan seems to have been in reality the Acheson Plan, if some understanding did not in his turn sell it to Acheson.

All of which is a very circuitous way of saying that the Truman Doctrine, for instance, is the doctrine of John Quincy Adams, and when, therefore, evacuation of our cities can no longer be considered the United Nations itself could not label as belonging to anyone.

The alternative to evacuation would be the construction of an alternative. But Peterson estimated that even if you built shelters to accommodate 100,000,000 people, an atomic attack on this country could still result in the death of half our population.

Thoughtfully, Peterson added it all up for us.

"In the final analysis," he said, "there is no such thing as a nuclear war."

Strangely enough, we think that admitting that fact is just about the most valuable defense service our Civil Defense Administrator could perform—to confess the hopelessness of his own assignment.

If we are going to survive the atomic age, it will be because we defend some will of our own, and not because we shall ever start, not because we try to run or burrow after it does start.

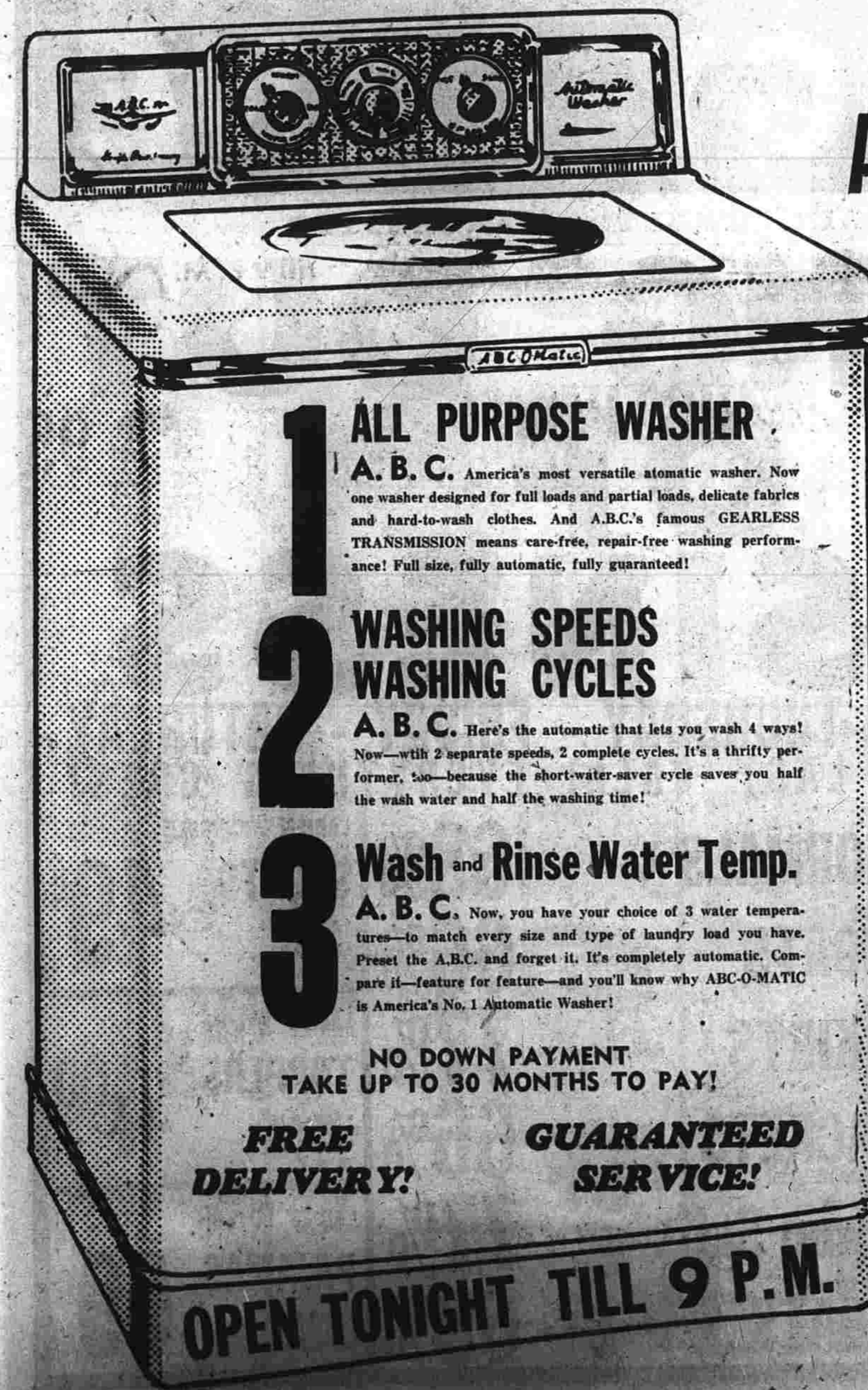

School Building Plans Shown at Atlantic City

By GEORGE E. GRAFF
 Superintendent of Schools in Atlantic City, N.J., is now attending the 85th annual convention of the American Association of School Administrators, meeting February 19-20 in Atlantic City, N.J.

Atlantic City, N.J., informally and flexibly characterizes the design of the many school building plans on display at the AASA convention this year.

One major section of the exhibit hall in Atlantic City's vast Convention Hall is devoted to the theme, "New Schools for Learning," and includes models, photographs, blueprints and plans of the latest in schoolhouse construction.

The more than 19,000 of us at this convention have been impressed by the fact that the design of school-like schools erected in the past decade is being replaced by a rambling structure that is functional and friendly. Campus-type plans with instructional units clustered around centrally located general service areas and the landscaped outdoor walkways serving wings of back-to-back classrooms reflect a new concept for corridor space to a minimum.

The newest and most striking feature is larger and deeper with natural light admitted through the ceiling and through large windows.

Architects seem to have leaned over backwards to make every square foot of space functional. An example of this is that building, which is equipped with stages designed to accommodate dramatic activities, as well as in the evening and in the afternoon.

More attention is also being given to parking space and the flow of traffic on school grounds.

Handling the increasing number of automobiles has become a major consideration in school planning.

A high spot of the architectural exhibit is a century of progress in school building displayed by the New York City Board of Education. This shows the how functional and architecturally pleasing school plants can be despite locations in highly congested areas.

Paul J. Mianer, president of the American Association of School Administrators, said that the 178 plans and models of new school buildings in one area is a feature of the entire convention.

Out of the constant stream of informal conversations centering around these booths many communities will undoubtedly have better designed, and more economical school buildings because the superintendents are learning about plans of construction which otherwise might have been overlooked.

In addition to these and other exhibits, 45 section meetings and eight general sessions are serving as exchange centers for practical ideas in all aspects of education.

Meanwhile, Dr. Clinton Cobb, executive administrator of the New York State Education Department, leaves his wife and one daughter to continue toward a college education. The principal's ability of education is the development of good citizens.

In his comments on the responsibility of education, Dr. Cobb said that reading, writing and arithmetic are the tools of good citizenship. Providing children with these

Why Sponsors Spend \$250,000 on TV Show

By CHARLES MEECE
 New York, Feb. 20 (AP)—In the world of television, you talk with actors, writers, directors, producers, technicians, executives. The ranks are legion. And when does nearly everybody talk about? The sponsor.

The sponsor of a television program is at once the most respected and feared, sought after and beloved, of the thousands involved in the TV industry. But to the millions of viewers he's an unknown. So let's finally talk to a sponsor.

Our subject's name is George L. Schultz and he is the president of a firm which manufactures toilet paper. At his direction his firm is spending \$250,000 to sponsor half of the CBS-TV production of "Cinderella" on March 31.

"Cinderella," a modern musical adaptation of the nursery tale, should be quite a show. For one thing it stars Julie Andrews of "My Fair Lady." For another, it will have original music by Richard Rogers and Oscar Hammerstein II. Also, pleasant to record, a relatively unknown performer, John Coltrane, will co-star with Miss Andrews.

However, the outcome of the show, it sounds like superior TV programming. And, let's not forget the ground rules of commercial television, unless somebody—meaning usually a sponsor—puts up money, it's not on TV.

So, why does a sponsor spend \$250,000 of his firm's money to sponsor half of the hour and a half program?

"We take the attitude," says Schultz, "that we are a quality product and we want to present it in a quality program. It's something different from the run-of-the-mill TV show. An example is 'See It Now' (CBS-TV). In December we sponsored that program. We received a wonderful public response. By that I mean it had a real effect on sales of our product."

Wanted: Right Shows
 "We told CBS that we were in the market for eight shows of what I'd call the 'spectacular' type. They were able to deliver less than we had in mind," says Schultz.

It's Schultz interested in sponsoring a program which might be called "controversial," meaning one which touches on such areas as politics, religion, racial relations.

Accepting that definition of "controversial," he said his firm was not inclined to be interested in such programs. He pointed out, however, that he has sponsored two "see it now" programs dealing with Africa and turned down the offer to sponsor the congress of the Treatment of the Israel-Bgyptian situation.

Dealing directly with CBS, instead of through an agency, the firm never has attempted to interfere with the content or format of a program, Schultz says, adding:

Witness Urges Lawyers Hold All Judge Posts

Hartford, Feb. 20 (AP)—The only trouble with some minor courts, witnesses told the legislature's Judiciary Committee yesterday, is that the judges are not lawyers.

Edward L. Reynolds, probably the most vocal critic of the abolition of the minor courts, said he would be incapable of giving a proper charge to a jury, he said.

Judge James Gartland of the East Haven court said he opposed any bill providing minor court judges to be lawyers. He said the Legislature ought not to act on such a proposal until the court re-organization question is settled. Gartland, who is not a lawyer, was the unsuccessful Third Congressional District Democratic candidate in 1952.

Any litigant dissatisfied with the judgment of a minor court has the right of appeal, Gartland added.

Reynolds said the proposal that judges be lawyers was favored by the New Haven County Bar Assn. Its enactment, he said, "will do away with a lot of talk among people on the streets that the minor courts ought to be abolished."

Race Bias Seen In Prep Schools Of Connecticut

Hartford, Feb. 20 (AP)—A former governor of Connecticut says many of the State's private preparatory schools discriminate against Negroes, he said yesterday.

Wilbert Snow of Middletown, in testimony at a State Capitol hearing on the subject, said he would hamper the schools in administering their affairs.

Snow, a professor emeritus at Wesleyan University, said there is no great problem of discrimination in Connecticut colleges and universities.

The National Broadcasting Council has unanimously endorsed a Government-appointed commission to investigate the operation of a 12-year period of television network that would reach 80 per cent of New York's population.

Drink Taxes Run High

Chicago—During fiscal 1956 State Governments collected \$547,000,000 in taxes on alcoholic beverages, with almost 65 per cent of the total coming from distilled spirits taxes. Only 20 states impose a tax on distilled spirits, but another 16 obtain revenue from liquor consumption through the operation of monopoly systems in which the States operate liquor stores.
