delays in recent days while carrying on negotiations with Israel, officials said it would not request any more delays now.

They said that while they are still prepared to go on talking with the Israelis, the Secretary of State is awaiting the return of the Israeli ambassador, Mr. Pinhas Rutenberg, who was expelled from the White House last week.

The President and the Secretary are also concerned by the fact that the Israeli government has not yet accepted the terms of the armistice agreement which was signed in 1949.

At the same time these informants said the United States is not interested in trying to punish Israel or impose penalties. It is only concerned with the removal of Israeli forces from the disputed regions.

Meanwhile the Eisenhower administration tried a new tactical maneuver. A half dozen American Jews who strongly support Israel met with Secretary Dulles and with presidential assistant, Maxwell Rabo at Dulles' office yesterday.

Dulles was reported to have urged this group to support the United States policy with the purpose of getting it to use its influence on the Israeli government. The only named member of the group was Bernard Baruch, president of the American Jewish Committee.

Baruch said after returning to New York, however, that the group had decided to keep its name secret and to withdraw its troops.

His request was made of Dulles and he said he had not been told what it would happen.

The Israeli government is expected to be a large part of the meeting and it is expected that some \$100 million a year in aid will be provided in the form of contributions and bond purchases.

There was evident disappointment here, but not much surprise at Ben-Gurion's refusal to accept the United States position. He said that the United States had no right to demand that Israel accept the terms of the armistice agreement.

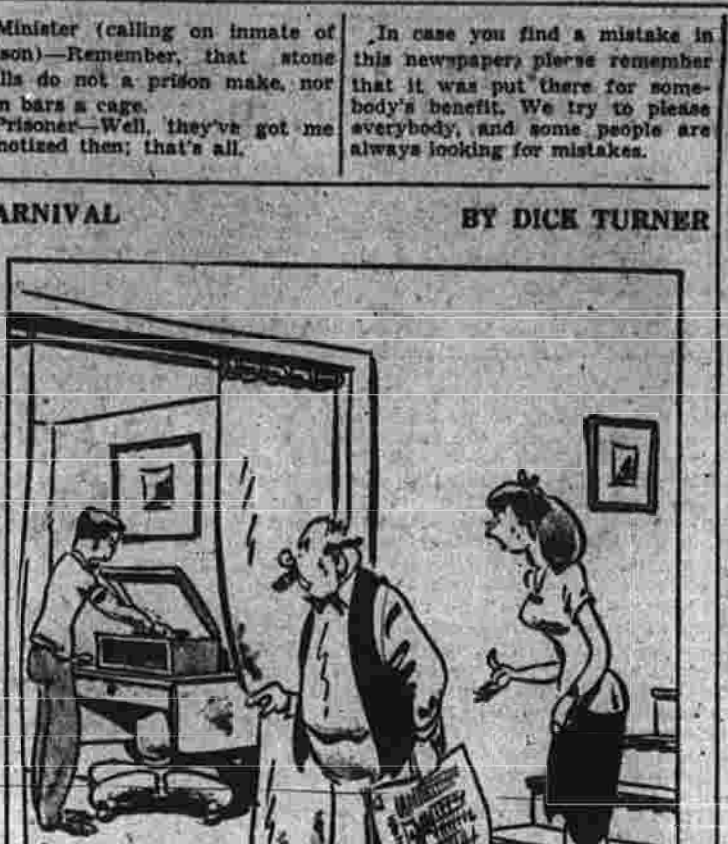
