**Bolton \$21 State Limit Predicted On Aid to Local Education**

Bolton, Feb. 23 (Special)—Any increase in State aid to education passed by the current Legislature is not expected to exceed Governor Ribicoff's recommendation of \$21 per pupil.

Rep. E. O. Smith, chairman of the General Assembly's Education Committee, made this prediction at a meeting of Bolton's Educational Association of Boards of Education here last night.

Smith, who outlined the provisions of other bills on State aid based his prediction on the fact that any more aid would throw the proposed budget out of balance. This would necessitate new

taxes or increase in present taxation for which, he pointed out, neither political party wanted to be responsible.

If more State aid is wanted, Smith advised the group, the people of the state must demonstrate their willingness to foot the bill and to convey this to their legislators.

He also expressed his belief that any increase in funds would not be earmarked for any particular part of the budget. This was in reference to the early recommendation of the Governor that the \$21 increase be designated for teachers' salaries.
