

In Israel, strong political reaction met the government's decision to pull out the troops. The rightwing Herut (Freedom) party, second dargest in the country and main opposition group, called for nationwide demonstrations against the move. Harut, which has 15 seats in the 126-member Knesset (Parkament), is an outgrowth of the underground Irgun Zva/Leumi that fought the British mandate authorities in Palestine before Israel got independence in 1948.


