Israel Lay Start Gaza, Acaba Military Withdrawal Tomorrow

United Nations, N. Y. March 3 (AP)—Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld plunged into a round of private talks today on his plans for taking over the Gaza Strip and the Sharm el Sheikh area of Egypt after Israel's withdrawal.
