Chappell Sees \$6,500 Net Gain For Next Year

Building Inspector Griswold Chappell expects to receive about \$6,500 more in salary next year than he plans to spend.

Chappell's budget request for the forthcoming year calls for \$128,000 and receipts of \$134,500.

Both estimates are vast increases over the figures for the fiscal year which ended last August 31. In that year expenditures were \$116,650 and receipts \$119,731.

The increase comes because during the current year building inspection services have been greatly expanded and rates for fees and licenses have also gone up.

Chappell's budget request contemplates no further increase in personnel, but the budget request provides for the virtually automatic salary increase for employees of one step on the anniversary date of their employment.

UAC Profits Up \$6 Million

East Hartford, Conn., March 7 (AP)—United Aircraft Corp. earnings were up to \$7.95 a common share in 1956—compared with \$2.14 the year before.

The company, in its annual statement yesterday, also reported a net income for 1956 of \$37,065,463, this compared with \$9,104,494 in 1955.

The statement showed that 96 per cent of the company's total 1956, \$52,853,142 sales went to the federal government. More than 8,000 1-27 engines, manufactured by Pratt & Whitney Division, were shipped to the armed forces.

Both total sales and commercial sales (\$15,068,170) were the highest in the company's history, it said. Total sales for 1955 were \$49,923,704.

United Aircraft said its total employment was 69,377 at the end of 1956, a boost of almost 10,000 during the year. Pratt & Whitney required 28,000 of the total, while the Sikorsky Helicopter Division and Stratford and the Hamilton Standard Propeller Division at Windsor Locks employed about 10,000 each.

The company said it plans expenditures of \$90 million in the next future for engineering and production facilities, \$60 million of this during 1957.

U.S. Coal Competitive
New York—Coal mined in the United States is being delivered to Europe in close competition with foreign-produced coal. The coal is by far the lowest of any national coal-producing country. Seventy per cent or more of the cost of American coal at the consumer's plant in Europe represents transportation and handling charges.

Wall-Cleaning Is Curbed
Caracas—A brand-new nationwide law in Venezuela establishes directions for pedestrian traffic in both urban and rural areas. Also, pedestrians are forbidden to stand in groups on crowded sidewalks and to lean against buildings with one foot resting against the wall. Violators are subject to fines ranging from the equivalent of \$3 to \$150, the latter being for repeat offenders.

Modern Sub Complex
Washington—The modern Navy submarine is the most compact and complicated man-of-war ever conceived. Tucked into a space about twice as large as the average 6-room house are living accommodations for a crew of 80 or 90 men, a control room, diesel engine, electric motors, fuel and water tanks, and 200 battery cells that weigh more than a ton each.

Leprosy Ships Planned
Auckland—The first of three small hospital ships to be used for leprosy relief work in the South Pacific is to be launched at Auckland's soon. The ships, provided by the New Zealand Leprosy Trust, Board cost £20,000 apiece. They will provide treatment for a total of 3,000 lepers.

Ship Program at Peak
New York—The United States now has underway the largest peacetime shipbuilding program in history. Last August, there were 36 ocean-going merchant ships, including seven passenger vessels, being constructed, reconversion, reconverted or on order. For fiscal 1957, about 3500,000,000 worth of new work, involving some 28 ships, is expected.

Shovels Standardized
Washington—Until recently, the Army Corps of Engineers stocked 28 round-pointed shovels that embodied various combinations of grips, handles, and blades. These now have been standardized to two models which serve the purpose equally as well.

Rate Food Irradiated
Chicago—According to the Bulletin of the National Society for Medical Research, four generations of rats have been living on irradiated food at the University of Michigan for the past two years with no harmful effects. Food consumed, the society's findings say, was irradiated at levels much higher than would be used for commercial pasteurization or sterilization.

City Banks' Forms
Chicago, Calif.—Officials of Chicago have stored special documents and forms in steel containers for safe-keeping in the event of a local disaster. The steel containers are stored at three different locations about five miles apart, and another group of forms is retained at the City Hall. One set each is at a private airfield, the municipal golf course, and the State Fairgrounds.

Smoking Adds to Smog
Los Angeles—The Los Angeles Air Pollution Control District says tobacco smoke adds almost 12 tons of contaminating chemicals to the air of Los Angeles County daily. The nearly 65,000,000 cigarettes smoked in the area each day produce 9,267 tons of particulates, plus ash, dyes, or gaseous acids, carbon monoxide, and hydrocarbons, the report says.

Soap Output Soars
Ottawa—The Canadian soap and detergent industry's annual production has increased from 337,000,000 to more than 1,000,000,000 in the past 10 years. Subsidaries wholly owned by the three largest manufacturers in the United States now account for 90 per cent of the output.

5 Million Women Fish
Washington—The Interior Department reports that a recent survey indicates that one in every four men and one in every 11 women in the United States are fishing enthusiasts. One in every five men and one in every 18 women are hunters. This means that 3,000,000 women fish, nearly 500,000 hunt.

Lengthy Novel Copied
Fort Madison, Iowa—Irma Stephenson of Fort Madison has just finished spending 35 days copying "The Wind in the Willows" by Kenneth Grahame. It was part of her job of testing pens and mechanical pencils for a company that manufactures them.

The House is expected to vote on a bill to extend farm price supports and farm income stabilization through 1970. The Senate has already passed a similar bill for the same period.

Syria Revokes Death Verdicts For 47 in Plot

Damascus, March 7.—No body is going to be executed after all as a result of Syria's show trial of 47 persons accused of plotting with Britain, France, Iraq and Turkey to overthrow the Syrian government. President Hafez Assad yesterday commuted the death sentences given five defendants in custody to life imprisonment. The other seven persons sentenced to death in the show trial have been freed. Assad confirmed that the 47 persons named in the show trial are free to return to their homes. The government also announced that it would pay the expenses of the 47 persons and their families.

Drugless Pain Killer Found For Dying Cancer Victims

By Rennie Taylor, AP Science Reporter. Houston, Tex., March 7.—A method of relieving pain in dying cancer patients without the use of narcotics or tranquilizers was announced by two Texas medical researchers. The procedure requires the injection of a small amount of pure alcohol in the spinal cord. A single treatment can banish pain for three to six months, said Dr. Robert C. Hay and Dr. William Derrick at the M. D. Anderson Hospital here. Dr. Derrick said he had the results of 81 cases in the eleventh annual symposium on fundamental cancer research. The research is sponsored by the National Cancer Institute of the University of Texas. Intrathecal pain is one of the worst features of the final stage of cancer. Narcotics relieve the agony for a while but eventually the patient becomes so tolerant of the drugs that they do little good. The alcohol treatment was effective in all but five of the cases. The procedure is the most difficult part of the procedure, which takes about an hour.
