Washington, March 9 (AP)—President Eisenhower today signed the Middle East resolution declaring this country's readiness to fight if necessary to block any Communist aggression in that troubled area.

The President said in a statement that the proposal which he recommended to Congress two months ago marks "an important forward step in the development of friendly relations between the United States and the Middle East area."

It is he said, "a further demonstration of the will of the American people to preserve peace and freedom in the world."

The resolution, which the President signed in the presence of the newsmen and photographers, is a special request, General McGeorge Bundy said, for the United States to use its military and economic aid to help the Middle East area.
