

## Your Income Tax Primer

Q. & A. On Business Deductions established home. May I deduct my expenses for meals and lodging?

A. No. Each place where you locate becomes your principal place of business and, therefore, you are not "away from home."

Q. I live and ordinarily work in Chicago. I have been temporarily assigned to a construction job located 20 miles outside Nashville. May I deduct my transportation expenses of going to and from work while I am in Nashville?

A. Yes. Under these circumstances, your necessary expenses in getting to and from your temporary job are business expenses and not commuting expenses.

Q. I live in Nashville. I am regularly employed at a location 20 miles outside of the city. There are no living accommodations within a reasonable distance of my place of employment. May I deduct my expenses of traveling to and from work?

A. No. Expenses of getting to and from your regular place of employment are not deductible, regardless of the distance you commute.







Brewster, heavily perspiring on the witness stand, told the Senate Rackets Investigating Committee he couldn't say how the "special ccount" money was spent. But he said he thought Claud dead, used it for state, county and city political contributions in Seattle and the State of Washing-Brewster denied the money was used to pay his personal expenses.
