Rockville Vernon Youths Escape Jail In School Safe Theft Case

Rockville, March 25 (Special)—Two 18-year-old Vernon youths who admitted stealing a safe from Vernon Elementary School March 8, each received a 6-month suspended sentence in City Court today.

The Rockville High School boys were also fined \$100 each and placed on restrictive probation for two years.

Both Prosecutor Harry H. Lutz and Judge Francis T. O'Loughlin said the youths could have been sent to State Prison and will end up there if there is any violation of the probation.

Donald J. Stevens, Lake St. and Thomas C. Nelson, Hartford Rd. Twp., each pleaded guilty to a charge of willful injury to public property. Three other charges on which the boys will be charged if there is a violation of their probation are breaking and entering, with criminal intent, larceny, and possession of burglary tools in the night season.

Any violation of the probation conditions will cause the offenders to be sent to jail for six months and appear in court on the three other charges which are punishable by 4 and 5-year State sentences, the prosecutor said.

Conditions of the 2-year probation include: Report to the probation officer periodically; restriction to home after 8 p.m.; compulsory church attendance; revocation of motor vehicle privileges; denial of work opportunities; denial of one another's company.

If you plan to prepare your own income tax return, you will be interested in the table printed with this article which shows the average deductions, as percentages of adjusted gross income, claimed by taxpayers in 1952.

It is always wise to have receipts for all your deductions. This is especially important if your deductions are not shown in the average shown in the table. But before you can deduct them, you must determine that medical, child care, casualty, and other deductions you can add on to the amounts covered in the previous chapter of the Income Tax Primer.

To determine your deductible medical expenses, you should first separate all amounts spent in 1952 for medicine and drugs because such amounts are subject to a special rule. Then add up all amounts paid for medical or dental care, including all the items described on page 9 of the official instructions.

South Windsor Proposed 64-House Project To Get Metropolitan Water

South Windsor, March 25 (Special)—Construction will begin late next month on a 64-house development on the north side of Pleasant Valley Rd. east of Rt. 3. The development will be the first in South Windsor to have metropolitan water.

The houses to be known as Pleasant Valley Estates, will be built by Remond Greiner, George C. Doherty, Samuel S. Bissady, builders of South Windsor Heights on Graham Rd. They have purchased 53 acres of land from John J. Krawak for the new development, which will consist of two different types of ranch homes and a split-level style.

The Water Bureau has been retained to install a main from Rt. 3, east along Pleasant Valley Rd. for a distance of about 2,300 feet. The newly appointed Water Committee will study the proposed installation and its effect on the town's water supply problem.

Purpose of the study is to determine the town's present and future water needs. The study will also determine the cost of the current building boom which is being experienced in South Windsor.

Members of the Committee, as appointed by the Board of Selectmen last week, are: Democrat, Paul Kupchunas and George Bolles, Atty. Daniel Cavanaugh and Peter Lutz, Independent, G. Martin Kraus, Herbert Holden, representing the Planning and Zoning Commission will meet with the Committee tomorrow.

The membership drive conducted by the Selectmen last week yesterday, netted 23 new members for the Post-Commander Russell Hitchcock, who has about 10 more veterans expressed interest in joining.

The drive for new members will be continued, according to the Commander, at a later date and a further canvass of the town will be made.

There will be a meeting of the Post-Commander's Council in the Town Hall, when the new members will be sworn in.

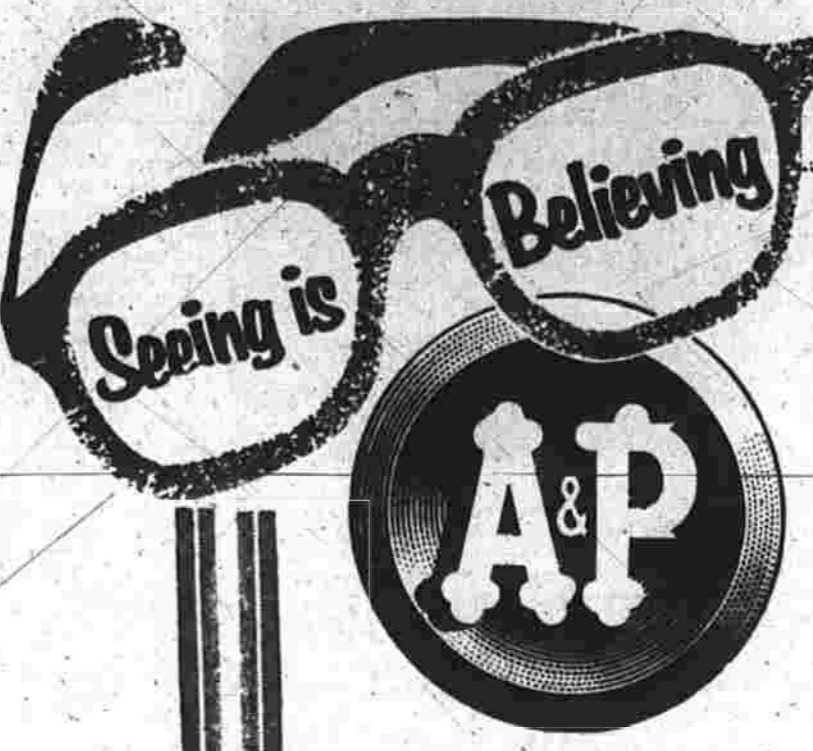

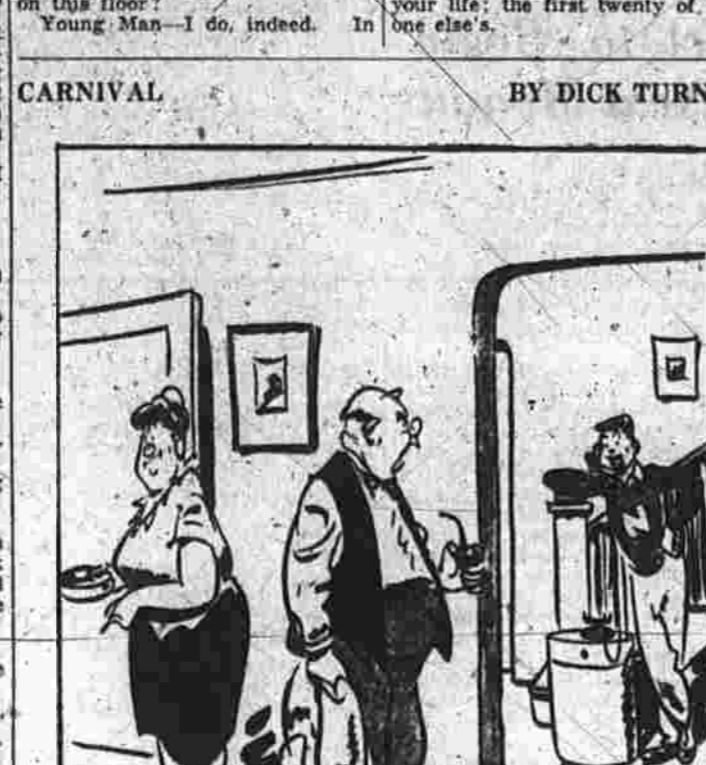

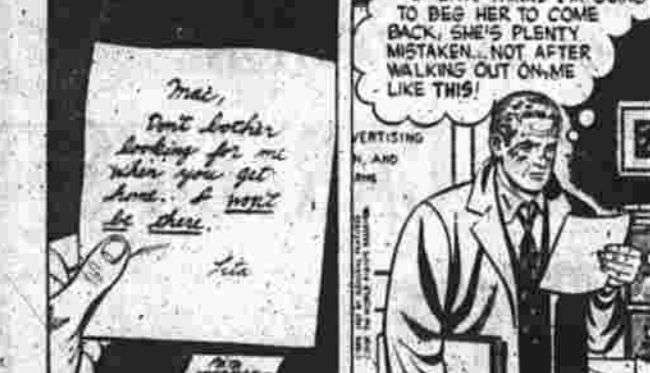
