



Why Keep Penalizing Local Insurance Companies?

ing the special flood tax the companies paid.) The increased taxes from insurance under the program will be greater percentage-wise than the increase projected in the Governor's budget for the corporate income tax or business taxes, exclusive of insurance.

The tax program which commenced in 1945 was non-partisan until 1955. The Democratic controlled Senate in 1949 and again in 1951 approved the program, as did the last Democratic The Connecticut insurance companies do about

5% of their business in Connecticut and 95% eleewhere; the Interest and Dividenda Tax is suposed on income from business done everywhere and not merely from business done in

The effect of this program is to remove gradually the double taxation with which the Connecticut chartered companies have been burdened.

The Ribicoff Administration's resistance to proposal that would bring Connecticut insurance taxes into line with other states is hard to understand. The proposal would continue eliminating gradually the discriminatory tax that now exists on interest and dividends of Connecticut insurance. companies. No other state has such a tax. It means a competitive disadvantage for local companies that employ thousands of Connecticut citizens. The Governor has contended that the companie already get preferential treatment. He based his opinion on facts given him by his Tax Commissioner, John L. Sullivan. Yet if he looks at Mr. Sullivan's

testimony before the General Assembly's Finance Committee he will find that his tax commissioner has a curious philosophy. Mr. Sullivan disputes the insurance claim that the double taxation could be eliminated without revenue loss to the state because rising business has made up the difference. No, thunders Mr. Sullivan, for if the tax rates had remained high, the state would have collected far in excess of \$15 million. Therefore the state has already suffered "an irretrievable loss of income." Maybe so. But if Mr. Sullivan wanted to carry

his theories to their logical extreme he could say that the state is suffering a fabulous loss of income because it does not take 100 per cent of what an individual earns, or it does not impose a 10 per cent sales tax on all he buys. Perhaps some day the state will seek to take that much revenue from those who work to earn it, but it will be a sorry day. What Mr. Sullivan is expressing is the natural refuc-tance of the tax-gatherer to give up any source of income or revenue once tapped—whether sit is fair Connecticut's insurance companies pay a tax on premiums; just as do the insurance companies of

other states. In addition, they must pay a tax on money they earn from investments in every state, of the union. That affects money that is often earmarked for reserves and/or figured into the rate structure. Admittedly, taxation of insurance companies in a complicated matter. But it is plain that Connecticut applies a double tax when it is interest. Connecticut applies a double tax when it insists on taxing dividends and interest as well as premiums. This state thereby penalizes companies that have a home office here, as contrasted with out-of-state

Under the circumstances it does seem reason-able to see that the insurance business, which has been the pride of Connecticut, pays only its fair share of taxes. The companies, percentage-wise, pays a far higher percentage of taxes than they employ people. But they do employ thousands of local citizens. And on the competitive strength of the local industry depends the livelihood of those employed.






