**New England Group
For Rail Competition**

Boston, April 3 (AP)—The New England Governors' Committee on Public Transportation today was recorded in favor of continuing the present competitive situation among railroads in the 6-state area.

The committee, headed by Governor Campbell of Massachusetts, opposed merger of the New Haven and Boston & Maine Railroads on the grounds it "would not be in the best interests of New England."

There has been suggestion that the two railroads merge. However, neither road has made any move for such action.

The report cited several adverse factors which is said make the present situation of New England railroads less favorable than that of roads in general in the United States.

Because of that, the report added, the average rate of return on the property investment of New England railroads is 1.98 per cent compared with 3.83 for all the Class I railroads.

Interstate Commerce Commission revision of the formula for ascertaining the cost of passenger train service with a view toward determining more accurately the amount of the passenger deficit or income.

Many Banks Report Earnings at Record

By SAM DAWSON
New York, April 3 (AP)—Many of the nation's banks today are reporting record earnings for the first quarter of the year.

But the seasonal easing in the demand for loans has been quite marked in the first three months of this year. The money market has been steady and occasionally talk of a drop in interest rates later on is heard.

Much of the demand for credit last year came from businessmen who have been turning cautious and many have been cutting back on inventories rather than building them up.

Business demand for funds last year was also swelled by the expansion drive which brought the acquiring of new plants and equipment to a record high. Such spending is still at the peak, but some observers look for that demand to fall off as 1957 progresses.

Near Profit Peak
With business activity generally leveling off, some bankers feel that the peak of business may be near or at its peak of profitability. Few, however, look for any major change in their position in the next few months.

While most of the banks were doing well in the earnings department, a number of them show a drop in total deposits. Part of this is seasonal, as corporations and individuals draw down their accounts to make income tax payments.

But part is from the competition for savings with other depositories that may pay better rates on their deposits.

A few banks have raised their rates on deposits to attract more funds, in an effort to draw in more savings and thus get more funds which can be lent profitably to businessmen.

Others have extended their branch systems, where state law permits, to get closer to possible savers. The Federal Reserve reports there are now 7,896 branches of banks in the nation, compared with 5,665 in 1940.

Brazil Fears Competition of Europe, Africa

By JULIUS GOLDEN
Rio de Janeiro, April 2 (AP)—Brazil more than ever depends on coffee for its livelihood.

Official records show that 70 per cent of Brazil's foreign exchange in 1956 came from sale of coffee—an increase of 11 per cent over 1955. The country exported \$1,050,000,000 worth.

This partly explains Brazilian fears over the projected creation of a common European market. Brazil thinks Africa may get more of Europe's coffee business—and that European money now being invested in Brazilian industry may be diverted to Africa.

Former Finance Minister Eugenio Gudin says: "Let's not fool ourselves. The technical ability and the capital of the Europeans, allied with semi-slave labor available in Africa, constitute formidable factors for production capable of inflicting upon us a tremendous economic defeat."

Economists have long pointed out the dangers any nation faces when it depends on one product for its income. Last year, due to a stable world coffee market, Brazil's foreign commercial balance was \$495 million. Next year, a poor world market could mean economic strangulation.

Indications are that Brazil will continue for years to be at the mercy of the coffee market. Efforts to gain a good share of the income from the sale of other products appear to be failing. 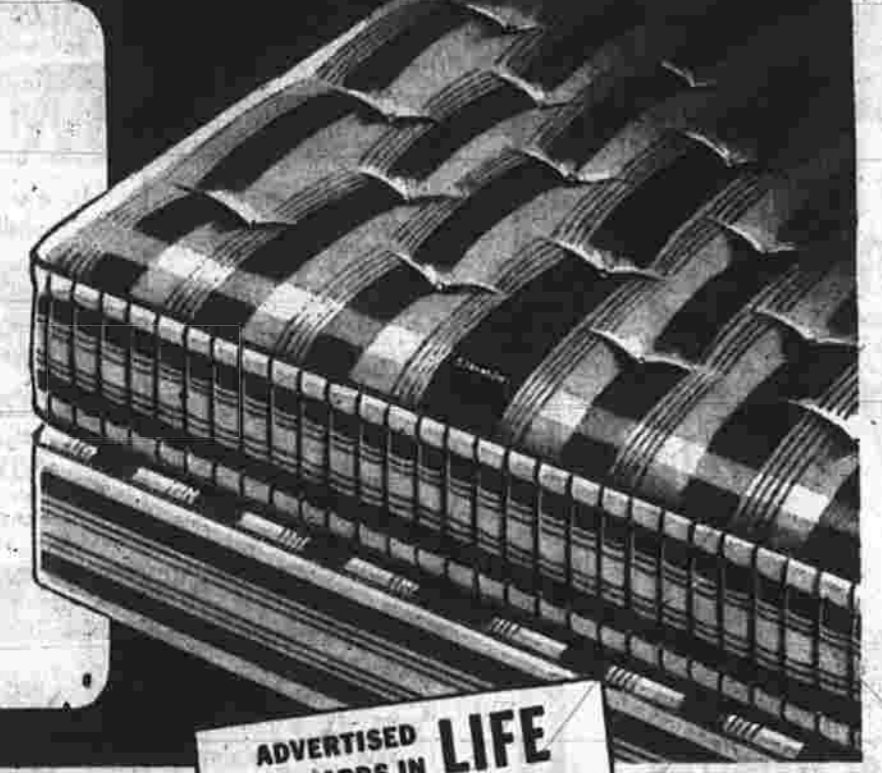

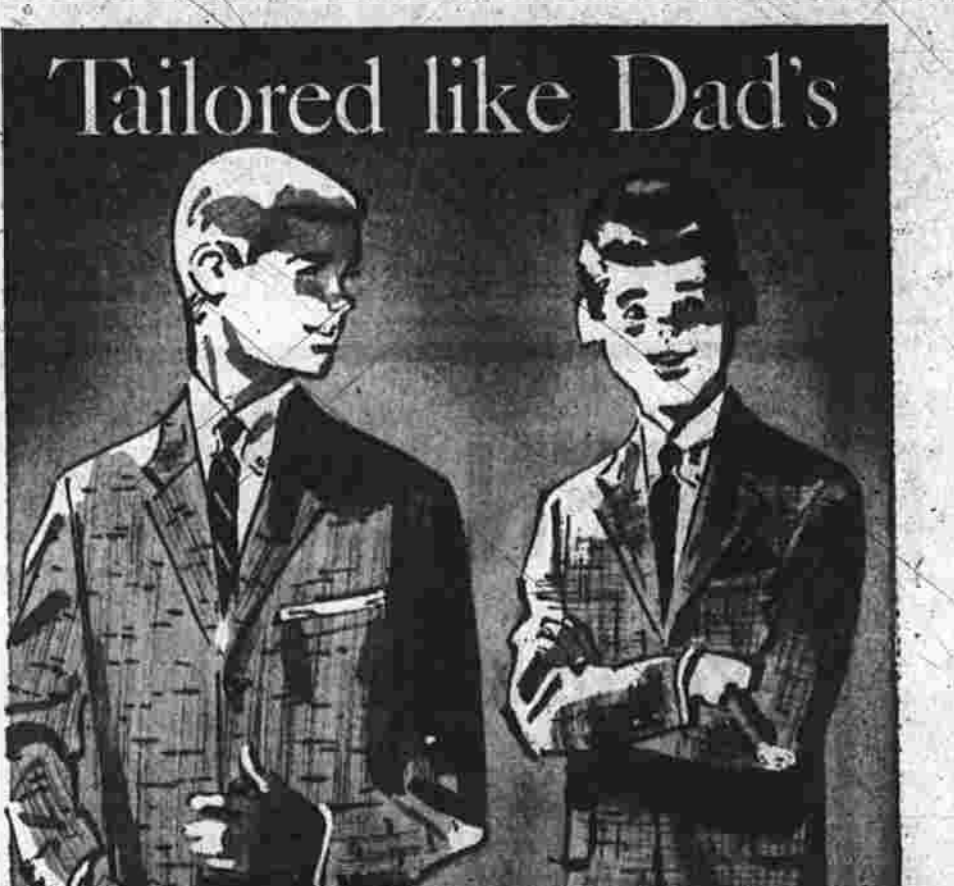

Counsel to Rule on Petition For Inequities Unit Ouster

Rockville, April 3 (Special)—A petition which would produce action designed to oust the newly-named Inequities Committee was questioned by the Board of Selectmen at its meeting last night. The Board has referred the matter to Harry R. Lutz, town counsel, for an opinion on its legality.

The petition was for a special town meeting and was filed with the Town Clerk Monday. Signed by 28 taxpayers, the petition "demands" that the Selectmen call a special Town Meeting to call for a referendum vote to rescind and withdraw the committee's authority to name an Inequities Committee; also, "to vote to discharge" the committee already chosen by the Board, and "to call for resolutions and recommendations as called-for regarding the selection of an Inequities Committee at the Town Meeting held at the Town Hall on Rockville, March 15, 1967."

Franklin G. Wallis, Second Selectman, termed the wording of the petition "outrageous." He also stated that the petition is listed on the Town Clerk's records as delinquent taxpayers. He added that the Selectmen will call a Town Meeting as requested if the petition is ruled legal.

The Inequities Committee was named by the Selectmen under power given them in a town meeting, March 12 and has a \$10,000 appropriation to hire a professional out-of-town firm to make a governmental study. The petition is the outgrowth of dissatisfaction among some rural residents in regard to the committee's name.

Manville, Seymour E. Lavitt, was named chairman of the Inequities Committee at the first meeting of the group last night. The committee, Lavitt said today, is going to seek information and advice on what should be required of a professional firm to study the three local governments. The committee has a \$10,000 appropriation for the study.

Lavitt said letters will be sent out to schools of government, governmental agencies and heads of other committees in Connecticut and nearby states where problems similar to Vermont's have been resolved.

The committee also discussed requirements for the professional firm to time limits and methods of approach.

The next meeting of the committee is scheduled for Tuesday.

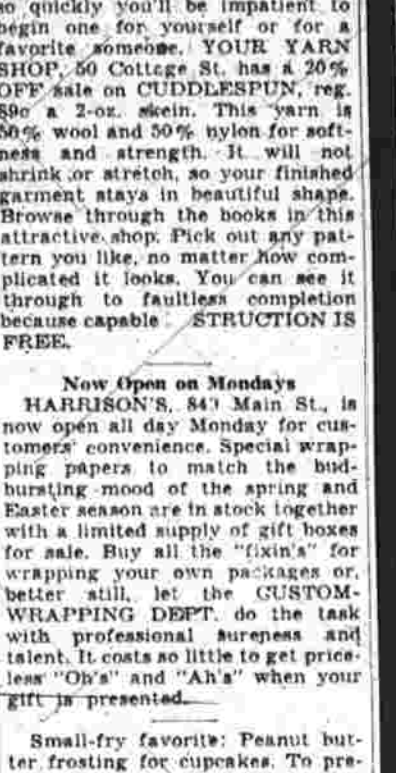

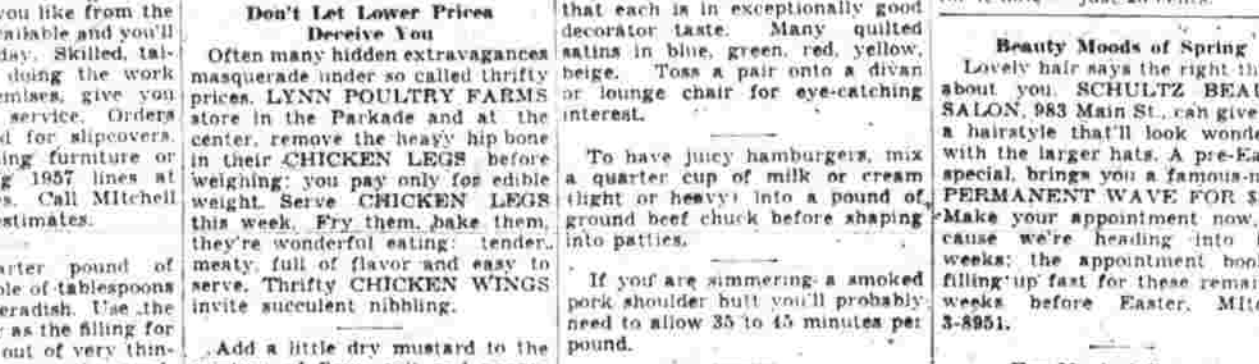

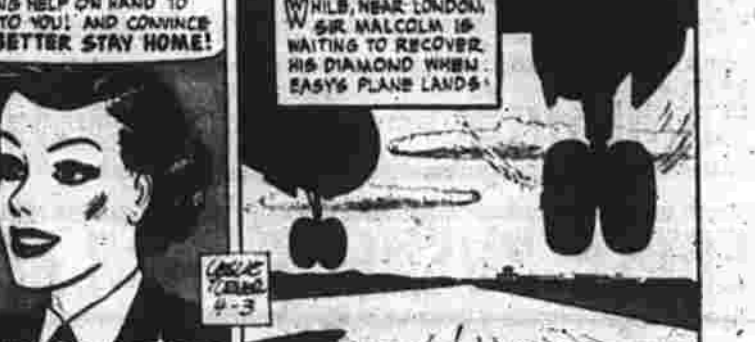
