New York, April 3 (P)—Many of the nation's banks today are reporting record earnings—byproduct of the general prosperity and the tight money policy.

In New York Ofly some of the country's biggest banks report first quarter net operating profits anywhere from 10 to 18 per cent above those made in the first three months of 1956.

Most of the banks reporting on their first quarter operations show that their customers, business firms and individuals, are borrowing more today than at this time last year—although not as much as at the end of last year.

Customers Paying More
And the customers are paying higher interest on their loans.

While business loans dropped in the first quarter, as they usually 40, their total is still at a postwarnigh for this season of the year. But business borrowing is now back to a seasonal pattern, rather than rising steeply as it did through much of 1956.

Commercial and industrial loans at New York banks is now about \$118 billion more than at this time last year.
