### Rockville Board Hires Nine Teachers, Six More Needed Next Year

Rockville, April 4 (Special)—Nine new teachers were approved last night by the Board of Education for the next school year. At the same time, Supt. of Schools Raymond E. Ramsdell announced the resignation of five present teachers and the possible resignation of an additional five. Exciting the possible resignations, there still exists a need for six more teachers, Ramsdell said. Two are needed in elementary schools and four in the high school.

Hired were: Barbara Cameron, Montpelier, Vt., at a yearly salary of \$4,600; Frank Harrison, Portland, Me., \$3,800; David Parker, Portland, Me., \$3,800; Beverly May, Westbrook, Me., \$3,600; Virginia Adler, Westbrook, Me., \$3,600; Lucille Washkevich, Seymour Conn., \$3,800; Lois Mulberry, Pritchburg, Mass., \$3,600; and Ellen Lethbrun, Lumburg, Mass., \$3,600.

Those teachers who have resigned during the past month, effective at the end of the current school year, are: Dean Moffatt, Grade 7, Vernon, who is to be married; Patricia Paulin, Grade 4, Vernon; Joan Scully, Grade 4, Northeast; and Carlene Smith, Grade 3, Maple St. all according to positions in New York; and Nancy Knack, Rockville High School, Math teacher, who is planning a trip.

Ramsdell presented to the Board a proposed lease for three classrooms in the parsonage house of First Congregational Church of Vernon. Town Council Harry H. Lane, whose opinion on the lease had been sought, suggested in a letter to the board that a rental figure be agreed upon which would include utilities and janitor services. The Board agreed this method would be more practical and instructed Ramsdell to discuss the point with William Johnson of the Church Board of Trustees.

The rental asked by the Church is \$500 per room annually plus an estimated \$600 for utilities adjustable at the end of the year. According to the lease presented, the school would furnish janitor service.

Need for still more classrooms led Supt. Ramsdell to suggest the basement of the County High School now used as one classroom be divided into two. The plan will involve erecting a sound-proof partition, removal of the stage and addition of an outside exit. On the basis of an estimate of \$1,150 given by John R. Gostler, the Board decided to award a contract. The rooms will probably house two first grades, Ramsdell said.

The superintendent revealed a plan to permit high school juniors and seniors who are considering teaching careers to spend next week in elementary classrooms. Only students whose grades meet high enough to permit their missing classes for a week will be given the teaching privilege. ### AP Newsman Gets Award on Press Heroism

New York, April 4 (AP)—The George Polk Memorial Award for courageous journalism was presented to Associated Press correspondent Endre Marton yesterday, just three hours after his arrival in this country from Vienna.

Marton, who covered the Hungarian revolution by Russian military might, shared the award with his wife Irena Nyilas, who worked for the United Press. Both spent many months in Hungarian Communist prisons on charges of espionage.

The Polk awards, given by Long Island University, honor the Columbia Broadcasting System correspondent who was murdered while on assignment in Greece in 1948.

In accepting the plaque, Marton, a Hungarian national, said: "Don't forget my unhappy country, Hungary. The story of Hungary is the story of the Spanish Civil War, the story of the Holocaust, the story of the atomic bomb."

He added, "I wish to use this platform to thank the Associated Press which was my family for the last 10 years—and it's a wonderful family."

George Polk's mother, Mrs. Adelaide Polk of Fort Worth, Tex., presented the award.

The Martons brought their two daughters with them. Marton has said he will seek U.S. citizenship.

### Roadhog Bill Wins Assembly Backing

Hartford, April 4 (AP)—The State Legislature's transportation committee gave its approval yesterday to a bill that would make it illegal to go too slow for prevailing traffic conditions on the Merritt and Wilbur Cross parkways.

The bill gives police the authority to arrest the motorist who goes too slow.

The current speed limit on the parkways is a maximum of 50 m.p.h.

The bill does not specify what is going too slow, but a State Motor Vehicle Department spokesman told the committee that some legislation is needed for the motorists who insist on going only 35 or 40 m.p.h.

**Few Voice Opinions On Martin's Budget**

A scant half dozen persons spoke out at the hearing last night on General Manager Richard Martin's 30-million budget for the fiscal year.

Joseph Dyer, 45 Parkview St., called on the Directors to cut the budget to one which could be financed by a 25-cent tax.

Robb, going through the budget, listed cuts he recommended, totaling \$120,000, less than a mill.

8. Provide no substitute teachers.
9. Robb argued that these figures are a better guide to the budget for Manchester schools than the standard used by Martin.
10. Martin made his \$184,000 cut by providing an increase of \$20 in per pupil cost, of only \$20 instead of the \$43 increase called for in the school report.

MEFA Supporters Robb's argument was supported by William Freeman, speaking for the Manchester Education Board. Freeman contended that even with the \$41 per pupil increase the per pupil cost for Manchester would not be the highest for comparable sized towns, but would be in the middle.

Patrice Martin had referred to a chart showing per pupil costs in various towns and the average for the State. He held that a \$20 increase, which is about the same as the increase per year in the past few years, would continue the general upward trend at about the same pace as elsewhere recently.

In general, the principles added up to saying the canal should be handled from Egyptian political control so that each user nation could be sure of no interference with its ships.

3. Egypt declined to give any outside group such as a users organization a controlling influence over the future development of the canal, asserting that it was unable to handle the affairs of the canal itself.
